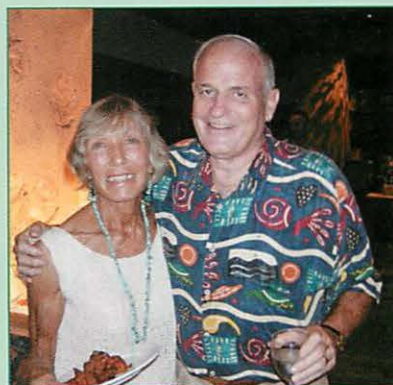

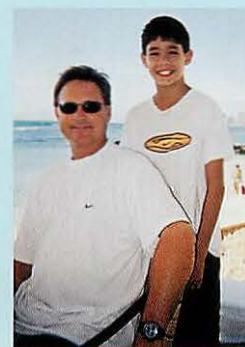

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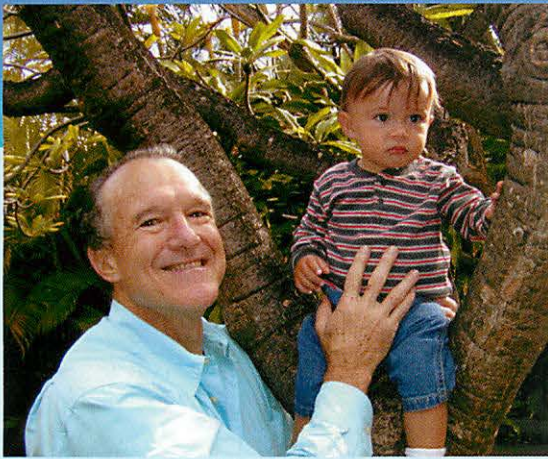

- A When a member is delinquent, the name is posted and a letter is sent. Credit and all Club privileges are suspended until payment is received. A one-time penalty of 5% is charged on the unpaid amount. If a member is delinquent four times, his membership is terminated.

**Tradition** -- The Outrigger Canoe Club was founded on Waikiki Beach in 1908 for the purpose of preserving surfing on boards and in canoes. The members of our club held the first annual Walter T. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki on July 4th, 1943. It is now the oldest ongoing outrigger canoe racing event in Hawaii.

**Mission** -- We are committed to providing an outrigger canoe paddling program for members to compete and be successful at the highest level. The emphasis is: to provide a safe, fun environment for members to learn skills and develop knowledge necessary to participate; to instill the values of respect, responsibility and sportsmanship to self, team, club and community; and to support competition and experiences for winning.

**Membership** -- All paddlers on our crews must be individual members of the Outrigger Canoe Club at the time the season begins even if a parent or sibling is a member. The application process may be initiated by a Regular Member of the Outrigger Canoe Club for individuals ten years of age and older. The membership process must be conducted through the Admission Committee and it usually takes a year or longer for adults and at least six months for children. Children of non-members may be sponsored by a Regular Member for Junior membership.

**Registration** -- Members desiring to participate on one the padding crews must register in early March every year. A copy of a valid birth certificate and a recent photograph is required to complete the registration. There are separate registration dates and fees for the regatta and the long distance seasons.

**Padding Season** -- The Regatta season begins in early June and ends in early August at the State Championships. The Long Distance season begins in August and ends with the Na Wahine O Ke Kai in late September and the Molokai Hoe in early October.

Perhaps the biggest concern of the past summers has been the issue of unattended children playing in the sand and beach front, particularly during the evening dinner hours. There is no other restaurant in town where you are allowed to let your small children loose to run between other diners tables.

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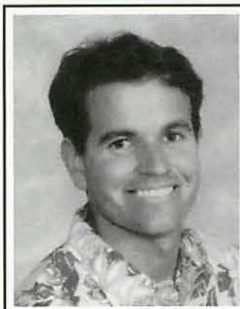
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# Backward Glances

## 94 Years Ago 1908

Alexander Hume Ford, President

The Outrigger Canoe Club was formally organized May 1 at the Promotions Committee rooms (Visitors Bureau) and elected Alexander Hume Ford, president; H. L. S. Herbert, vice-president; Henry P. O'Sullivan, secretary; Richard H. Trent, treasurer; Kenny Winters, captain; Charles Russell Frazier, auditor; J. P. Clark, Harry Macfarlane Jr., and J. R. Galt, trustees.

"Maintaining a spot on Waikiki Beach where surfboards and canoe enthusiasts may keep their canoes and surfboards, that the royal sport of surfing may be preserved in Hawaii. Annual Dues \$5.00 a year to actual surfers, men and boys. To those using the Club as a place to entertain visiting friends \$10."

The Outrigger Club Roster as of May 1, had 101 members of which 15 were juniors.

Leases for the first Clubhouse were signed on May 19. Lacking finances, two grass houses at the Old Zoo were purchased and installed on May 27. Why bother about the lack of shower facilities the Aiea Stream flowed through the Club grounds and formed a fresh water lagoon at the beach!

On May 20, Allan Herbert became the first Life Member.

## 54 Years Ago 1948

The Board of Directors announced a quota of 250 for Junior members. Acceptances of applicants was limited to the children of members in good standing.

Club Manager Ted Magill and Neil Iversen organized committees of Junior boys and girls to formulate behavior rules for junior members on and about the Club grounds and to propose effective entertainment for the months of June, July and August. Committee members were William Heilbron, William Cross, Robert Muirhead, Tita Marks, Pat Honl and Margie Church.

The Volleyball Doubles Tournament awards were presented to Sarge Kahanamoku and Tommy Arnett, winners; Jack Ackerman and Bill Cook, runnersup, and Lloyd Chiswick and Bobby Dolan, third place. May 21 a dinner-dance was given by the Volleyball Committee to raise funds for a home and home series of volleyball games between the Jonathan Club of Los Angeles and the Outrigger. Music was provided by Bill Smith and his boys, the Stardust Navy Band and Sol Hoopii with his steel guitar.

OCC celebrated Maritime Day. The Club furnished a double outrigger canoe with a chanter and a Hawaiian "chief" to form a regatta of 10 outriggers manned by members. The fleet rendezvoused with the

USS Iroquois and a flotilla off the reef opposite the Club for a ceremony to commemorate those who died in maritime service. A program held later at the Club was broadcast over the Hawaii Calls radio program. Repairs were completed on the canoe *Captain* and offered for Senior members' use. Members wishing to qualify as steersmen were to apply to Harold "Dope" Yap, chairman of the Canoe Committee.

Also, a new Polynesian sailing canoe was purchased from Dick Black. To learn to sail or just to ride it, members were to contact Dope Yap.

Coach Bob Kiphuth, maker of Olympic champions and Yale champions for 31 years, listed his nominations of an all-time swimming team. All swimmers named earned their inclusion by virtue of Olympic performances with the exception of Bill Smith and Keo Nakama. Those listed from Hawaii were: Sprints (100 & 200-meter Freestyle) Duke Kahanamoku 1912 and 1920 Olympics; Middle Distance (400 and 1500 meter Freestyle) Clarence "Buster" Crabb—1932 Olympics; Bill Smith, Keo Nakama; 100-Meter Backstroke Warren Kealoha 1920 and 1924 Olympics.
