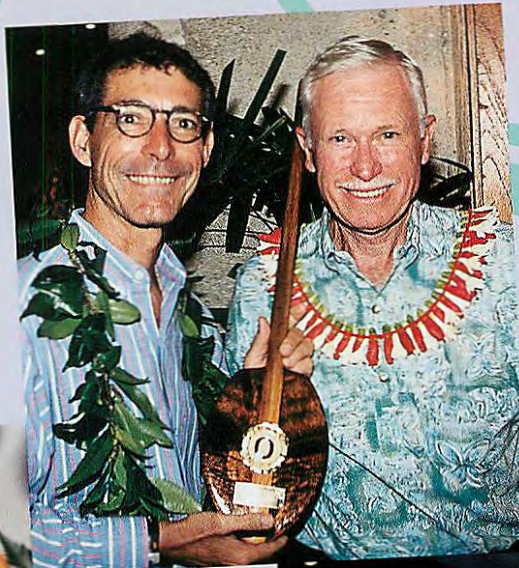

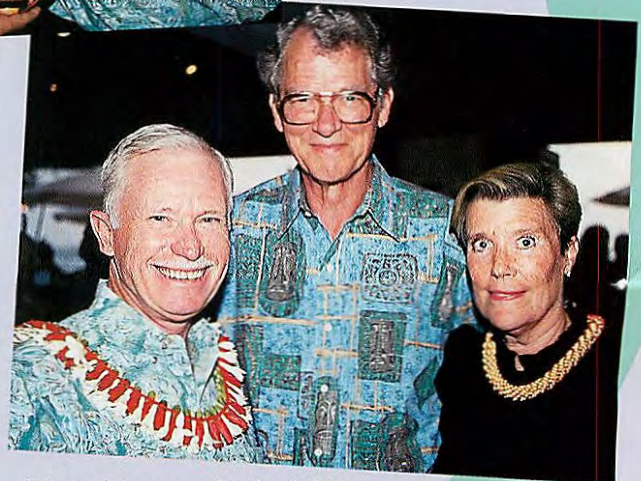
Outgoing president Karl Heyer IV was presented with a miniature koa canoe, carved by Domi Gose, by President Hal Henderson.



Jimmy McMahon, OCC President in 1999, was the recipient of a koa paddle.

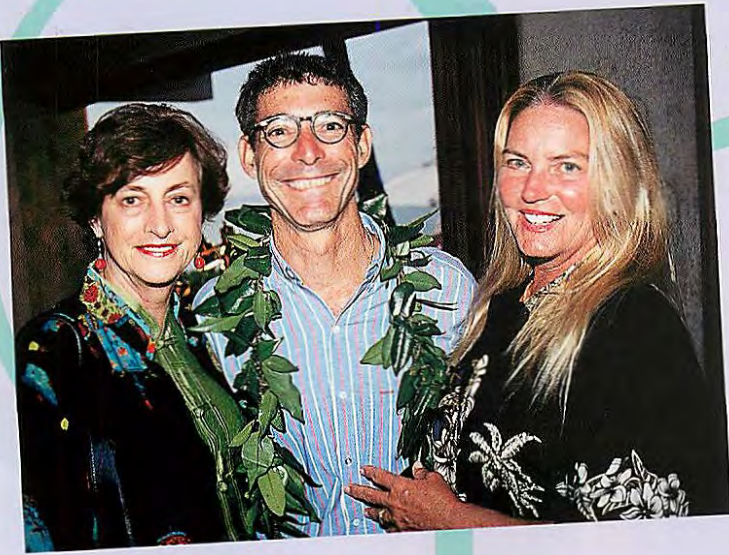

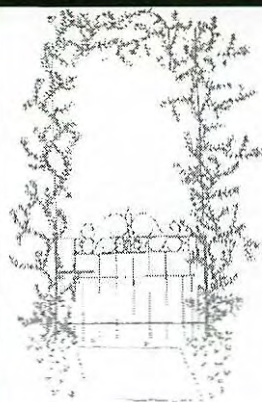

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OCC Biathlon Is a Three Ring Circus

Yes, indeed, the 4th Annual Outrigger Canoe Club Biathlon/Relay/Keiki Run on Saturday, June 16, will be a three-ring circus put on by the OCC Running and Swimming committees.

There are three events going on at the same time. A Biathlon consisting of a 5K Run and 800-meter swim will be accompanied by a relay as well, so two participants, one swimmer and one runner, will participate. We'll even have a masters division. We'll have a male, female and mixed relay team, whose combined ages must be over 100.

There will be trophies for first, second and third for each event. A total of 38 trophies will be given out for the relay division.

Haili Volleyball Tournament a Success

In the finals of the A Men's Division, Ryan Haneberg receives a "facial" from a Sideout (the opponent) outside hitter in the waning minutes of their third game tie breaker and the anti-OCC crowd goes wild with applause.

Not only does Ryan jump up and lead his team to a thrilling third game victory for the championship but he is rewarded with the Most Valuable Player designation for this highly competitive division.

The OCC A team cruised through their preliminary matches until they met up with the OCC 18s boys team in the quarter finals and withstood a fierce challenge from the young stallions to eke out a 25-23, 25-23 victory in a match featuring many long rallies. After a quick semifinal win, the A men played Sideout (the number one seed in the tournament) where they handily won game one, lost game two due to a temporary letdown and then would not be denied in game three with an exciting 15-11 win.

Joining Haneberg on the all-tournament team were setter Rick Humphreys and middle blocker Jon Andersen. Captain and middle blocker, Danny McInerney, outside hitters Ross Holcomb, Milo Haneberg, and Chris Siegfried rounded out this roster of volleyball veterans.

The OCC Masters dominated their division once again without dropping a game throughout the entire tournament. Combining a nice mix of fifty somethings Randy Shaw, Jon Stanley, Tom Madison, and Charlie Jenkins and young forty somethings Jay Anderson, Jimmy Kalaukoa, T.C. Gray and Bill Lawson provided for an unbeatable combination.

Typical of their performance this year, they completely overpowered their finals opponent, Bucky's of Kauai, 25-18, 25-20, to garner the championship. Jon Stanley was selected Most Valuable Player and was joined on the all-tournament team by team captain Randy Shaw.

The Boys 18s and 17s did not bring home any gold this year but each team had its share of successes.

The 18s breezed through their pool matches dropping only one game and soundly trounced their first playoff opponent on Friday afternoon. Then by the fault of a questionable tournament bracket, they drew the OCC A men in the quarter finals rather than the semis or finals which would have been a fairer pairing due to the strength of each team and last year's finishes.

No such luxury for the Outrigger and so the teams met in a thrilling and crowd pleasing match with many long rallies. Both games went down to close finishes characterized by great defense by the A men and spectacular front and back row attacking by the boys.

Throw in a couple of questionable ref calls, some major goofs by both teams and deafening crowd noise which all made for one of the best matches of the tournament. The A men prevailed 25-23, 25-23 and the boys only consolation was that they lost to the eventual tourney champions.

The roster included outside hitters Kaimi Guerreiro, Will Reppun, Arist deWolff, Brian Zodrow and Daniel Lam; middle blockers, Aka Beaumont and Justin Harris; setters Gary Johnson and Clint Torres and Kaione Scott. The team was ably coached by Lyman Lacro and Alikia Williams.

The young and learning OCC 17s team's goal at Haili was to finish in the top two in pool play and make it to the playoffs and that is exactly what they did.

Entered in the largest division, Men's B, they started with a con-

vincing victory on Wednesday by literally blocking their opponent, Hawaiiki, off the court and winning two straight. That night the magic was gone as they struggled in a two game loss.

Thursday's final match would decide if they continued on to the playoffs and they regrouped with a decisive victory. On Friday they played gallantly against a veteran men's team showing flashes of brilliance but eventually losing two close games. Hoping to improve on ball control and consistency, the boys nonetheless laid the foundation for a solid team that will be ready for the Junior Nationals this summer in Phoenix, Arizona.

The team was comprised of outside hitters, Nate Jenkins, Max dewolff, Ryan Zabriskie, Sean Carney, Matt Yep and Pono Brown, and middle blockers, Tamahere McCabe, Patrick Alexander and John Freese, setter Ian Alexander and Bronson Soares and Matt Moore. Jim Kalaukoa and Charlie Jenkins coached this spirited team.

The players and coaches of our four teams would like to thank the Outrigger Canoe Club for their generous support of our trip to the Haili Men's Tournament, the premier volleyball championship in the state of Hawaii.

Next month, *Extra Innings* will feature pictorials of the team, information on Summer and Fall action and recap the games played in May.

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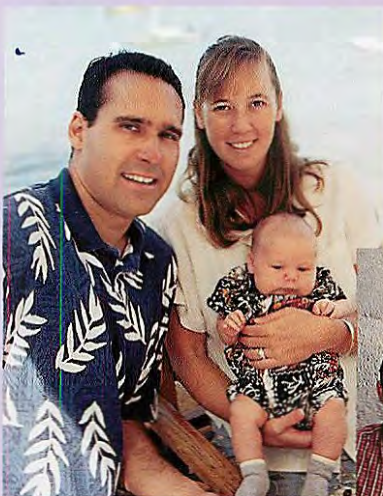

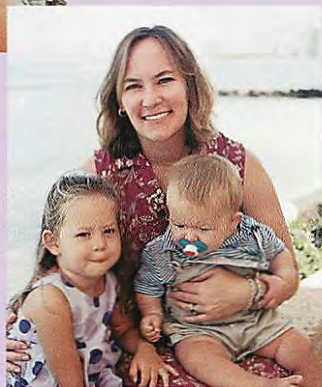

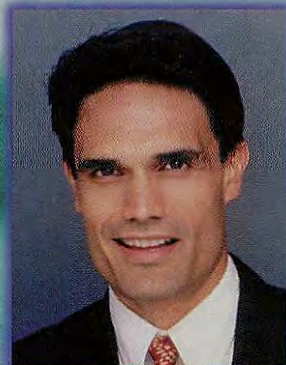

Junior surf team members continue to take away first place finishes in the Hawaiian Amateur Surfing Association (HASA) meets. In the most recent event, held March 31 – April 1, at Diamond Head, 18 year-old Keegan Edwards and 14 year-old Amy Lawson successfully made their way through the qualifying heats and finished first in their final heats.

Keegan surfed in the Men's Longboard Division and Amy competed in the Girls Short board (17 years and under) Division. It should be mentioned that Amy out surfed several well-known, older girls.

Amy, an 8th grader at Iolani School, has consistently been placing high in the events in which she has competed. She placed 2nd in HASA event #1 (short board division) and 5th place in the long board division. She placed 3rd in the long board division of HASA event #7 and 5th in the long board division. She earned 2nd place in the Town & Country Grom contest held at Queens in the summer of 2000. She also placed 1st in short board and 1st in long board in the Faith Riding contest, Fall 2000.

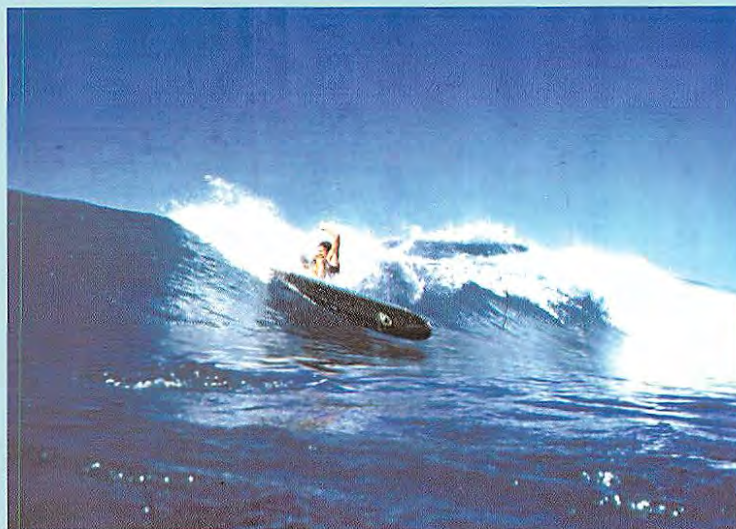
OCC Surf Contest

In the Keo Nakama Swim, OCC made a clean sweep in the 100-yard dash surfboard race. Finishing 1st, 2nd and 3rd, respectively, were Tommy Shroeder, Tommy Haynes and Paul Dolan.

Outrigger Club Song Contest. "In keeping with the traditional water and athletic sports promotion, betterment of the Club and the need for an official pep song to describe our Club purposes and to inspire our athletes and members, the theme of the official song desired, is self-evident." Submission of music and lyrics were invited from Club members, general public, professional or amateur with a prize of \$100.00. Judges were Buddy Peterson, Rolly Wray, Frank Owens and Harry Nordmark. The prize winning song was "The Old Outrigger Club at Waikiki" with words and lyrics by Leonard Hawks.

Summer Fun for Juniors—George "Dad" Center was engaged by the Club to reorganize and supervise Junior member summer activities. He was given full powers to discipline any junior member for infraction of rules, poor sportsmanship or "ungentlemanly conduct."

Refurbishment and modification of the Wahine Senior Locker Room was approved. Upon completion yearly fees were set for full length lockers \$10; one-half length lockers \$5, and small lockers \$2.

30 Years Ago—1971

The canoe season started with the Kamehameha Day Regatta at Kailua Beach Park. OCC won three 1st places in the 12, 13 and 12A Boys events and also in the Women's Novice B.

The Junior Athletic Summer Program got off to a fast start under the direction of Tommy Holmes with 83 youngsters in the 8 to 14 age bracket.

15 Years Ago—1986

The Board of Directors approved a budget not to exceed \$21,000 for the USVBA National Championships.

The 6th Summer Surf Paddleboard Race was held with 51 contestants competing.

In the first Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's race of the season, OCC won the King Kamehameha Day Regatta at Kailua Beach by scoring 83 points.

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Board Briefs

Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting on March 22, 2001.

Vice-President of Activities Report – Glenn Perry was appointed as the Board's liaison to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation.

Vice-President of Operations – The OCC website is being updated and maintained by an OCC employee. The staff is seeking guidance on content for the website.

Secretary's Report – Nine members were suspended for 15 days for being three times delinquent in paying their accounts.

Manager's Report – The Winged "O" requested a reorganization in which they would establish a chair and function as an athletic subcommittee under the Club Captain and Athletic Coordinating Director. . . The Club had a net operating income of \$8,017 for February.

Admissions & Membership Report – The membership count was 4,455 as of February 28, 2001.

Athletic Report – The Board approved a reallocation and management recommendations on boat locker space. All boat lockers will be assigned by precedence of date on the waiting list. All classes of dues paying members are eligible including spouse associate members. Spouse members who are not associates are not eligible. One locker is allowed per individual. Subletting and renting out assigned lockers is not allowed. In accordance with the Club's purpose to promote athletic sports and activities, lockers are for actively used boats, not for long term storage. To maintain the use of a locker, the stored boat must be used by the owner no less than twice monthly averaged over periods of six months. Persons renting a boat locker will be required to sign a letter acknowledging the above conditions of use, the monthly fee, non-responsibility of the Club for damage or theft, and the non-responsibility of the Club for monitoring the safe return of paddlers

who log out. The Board indicated that it would monitor the status of spouse members lockers. The Club Captain and General Manager will continue to monitor the usage of lockers. . . The summer fun program will be held in two sessions, June 11-22 and July 16-27. The charge is \$195 per session and is open to OCC members ages 10-14. Sessions will run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

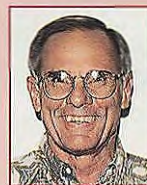
Public Relations Report – The Board approved a request to pay Joss \$1,000 for photos for the 2002 Club Calendar.
