

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q Who may advertise in The Outrigger magazine?
- A Advertising Director Pam Davis says that advertising is open to Outrigger Canoe Club members. Nonmembers may advertise if space is available and if they are sponsored by a Club member in good standing. Priority is always given to members. Members are charged a lower rate than non-members.
- Q Why must we sign in when we enter the Club?
- A All members are required to sign in when first entering the Club. This is necessary to preserve our private club status.
- Q Are cellular phones allowed on the Club premises?
- A Yes, but not in the Koa Lanai, Hau Terrace and Lounge.
- Q What are the requirements for Associate membership, and can Associates vote?
- A Associate members are spouses of Senior, Regular, Life or Intermediate members, and/or persons 18 through 25 years of age who are either full time students attending an accredited school or college, or on active military duty in a non-commissioned status during such period of duty. Associate members may not vote.

For the past 24 years, the Women's 10K race has passed the front door of the Club. Now scheduled for the first weekend in March, our wahine members enjoy entering, and are always cheered by Club spectators, coffee cups in hand, in the grass divider along Kalakaua.

Gerry DeBenedetti has completed all 24 of these races, and there are only nine other women in Hawaii that can make this claim.

Last year, after the 2000 race, reflecting on the fact that she had 23 10K shirts, she realized she could have the PERFECT 10K QUILT with all those T shirts. After all, every member of the Club has an overflowing T shirt drawer.

On her next trip to California to visit her mother, she took the T shirts, a design, and the backing material of a reverse brown tapa pattern.

She and her mother collaborated on not one, but two quilts, of 10 years each, which Gerry calls her decade quilts. Quilt one has 1978-87, Quilt two has 1988-97, and pending quilt three will start with 1998 and end with 2007. There is enough backing material set aside for long range quilt four, the year 2017.

Gerry plans to be the survivor of the original women who ran the Honolulu Women's 10K in 1978.

The Quilts and Gerry appeared in the Honolulu Advertiser in a Sunday feature article, on Channel 13 with Linda Hosek, Channel 4 with Jill Kuramoto, the quilts were displayed at the Women's 10K on March 4, and are now on display at the Queens Hospital Dining room wall.


The Board announced the results of the general membership survey. Members gave the Club ratings ranging from A- to C/C+. The purpose of the survey was to assess the degree of member satisfaction with various services and operations the Club provides in 10 separate areas. Areas of most concern were the Hau Terrace, Bar/Cocktail Lounge, and Locker Rooms. Three areas received ratings of A-: Beach Shop, Snack Shop and Beach Services/Volleyball Court. Member response totaled 848 surveys returned.

The Canoe Sports Hawaii Kaiwi Challenge Team One Man Canoe Race from Kaluakoi Hotel to OCC was held. Seven two-man teams, one two-woman team, and one solo completed the course. OCC members Tom Connor and Kala Judd were the winners followed by Walter Guild and Mark Rigg.

OCC won its first tournament championship in water polo in the Big Island Water Polo Tournament. Outrigger scored 11 and Rainbow Aquatics, 9.

OCC won two USVBA national championships in Kansas City, competing with 268 teams from all over the country—the 40s Division and the Open Division. Nineteen matches and 41 games were played in seven days.


Afternoon Delights



OCC Biathalon/Relay and Keiki Run June 16
