

Macfarlane Win Highlights 4th of July

From the paddler's breakfast on the Hau Terrace to the Masters men's victory in the final event of the Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach, it was a glorious 4th of July for Outrigger Canoe Club paddlers.

The Girls 12's started the regatta off with a win and Club paddlers dominated the rest of the day, scoring 99 points to runner up Kailua's 49 points. Lanikai was third with 48.

Outrigger won 15 events, was second in five, third in three and fourth in three.

Most of the Macfarlane perpetual trophies came home to the Club, particularly the Matson trophy for the Senior Men's race. Our Senior Men and Women both sipped champagne from silver bowls at the awards ceremony at the end of the regatta. Outrigger totally swept the upper division women's events, capturing the Freshmen, Sophomore, Junior, Senior and Open 4 events, as well as the Girls 16's and 18's and Senior Masters.

A new trophy was added this year in memory of Bob Fischer. The trophy goes to the winner of the Novice B Women's event.

Three OCC crews remain undefeated--the Girls 16's, Boys 18's and Senior Women. The Freshmen Men and Women, Senior Men and Novice A Men all have 4-1 records.

Outrigger is undefeated this season, with one tie in the opening regatta of the season.

The state championships will be held August 3 in Hilo. Outrigger has won the state championship for the past seven years.



Named to the all-tournament team were Riggers Mark Bradley, Matt Corboy and Bruce Gordon, all with six goals each.


The team's overall record is 7 wins, 3 losses and 1 tie.







OCC Wins 2 USVBA Championships

Four OCC volleyball teams traveled to the land of tornados and thunderstorms to compete in the 1991 U.S. Volleyball Association national championships, May 25-31 in Kansas City, Mo.

The tournament consisted of 268 teams from all over the country. The tournament format for all matches was two out of three games to 15 points, with the third game rally scoring format (that is, a point scored for every serve or side out, just like ping pong). The first two games also are limited by time allotment.

And about Golden Masters? Well.


I'll talk about them later.

The players receiving national recognition were Chris Crabb, 2nd team All American; Randy Shaw, Charlie Jenkins, 1st team, and Jon Stanley (at 47 years of age) the tourney MVP.

The 40 division ended at 11:30 p.m. Tuesday night and the OCC 35's began pool play at 8 a.m. Wednesday morning with four matches scheduled throughout the day with a total of 30 teams.

To compound matters, Charlie Jenkins pulled a leg muscle in the 40 finals and was unable to compete in this division. That left Ralph Smith as the setter for the team--a position he hadn't practiced all season because he was needed as an outside hitter.



OCC's Best Chefs

Everyone loves a meal you can pick up and make a mess with! We make our tortillas from scratch and it makes your tacos incredible! The tacos found in the deli section will do, if you aren't too picky.

Corn Tortillas

2 cups Masa Corn Flour

1 cup water

1 flat plate

Saran Wrap

Mix 2 cups of Masa flour and 1 cup water. Kneed the flour into round balls a little larger than the size of golf balls. Not too wet. Place the balls between two pieces of Saran Wrap and squash them with a flat plate until about 6" round. Heat a teflon pan and cook each side until firm. Flip 'em like flap jacks. Store until it's time to fry them in hot cooking oil. Cook each side until almost crisp. Remember they have to fold.

Note: keep the dough on the dry side for best results.

Makes about 6. More flour and water, more tacos.

We also make our own salsa. The salsa is a big hit and goes well with chips too.

Sherri's Shoutin' Good Salsa

4 medium tomatoes (plum tomatoes if possible), 1 1/2 pounds diced

1/2 cup diced onion

1/2 cup diced celery

1/4 cup diced green bell pepper

1/4 cup olive oil

1 clove crushed and diced garlic (optional) 2 to 3 tablespoons canned crushed green

chili peppers, add hot peppers if you like

2 tablespoons red wine vinegar

1 teaspoon mustard seed

1 teaspoon salt

4 sprigs Chinese parsley, diced Fresh ground pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients into a large bowl. Then let sit for several hours in the refrigerator. Squeeze a wedge of lime at serving time. Serve over tacos.

Meats/Fowls

2-3 pounds (brisket) flank steak or skinless chicken breasts

1-2 cloves crushed garlic

1/8 teaspoon cumin

1/4 teaspoon oregano

1/8 teaspoon celery salt

1/8 teaspoon garlic salt

1/4 teaspoon Lawrey's salt

Ground pepper to taste

I like using brisket or flank steak myself and would highly recommend it because the cut is lean and full of taste. Barbecue over kiawe for the best results. You may broil just as easily.

Prepare the meats by covering them with ground pepper, cumin, oregano, garlic salt, celery salt and Lawrey's salt. Top with crushed garlic, refrigerate and let sit 2 hours in a zip lock bag.

Dad Center Race Scheduled August 25

The 19th Annual Dad Center Long Distance Canoe Race for women will be held on Sunday, August 25. The race starts at Kailua Beach Park and finishes at the Outrigger beach around noon.

Outrigger sponsors the 22-mile race each year for women's crews. Competition is held in both open and masters divisions.



Running Clinics Planned


August 14 in Kapiolani Park across from the entrance to the Club at 5:30 p.m. for the first clinic. A training fun run will follow.

Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting on May 30, 1991 and the Executive Committee meeting on June 13.

Treasurer's Report: Net income for April was \$24,121 which was \$3,126 below budget and \$3,171 below April, 1990. . . There was a net increase in member's equity of \$76,447. The year to date increase in member's equity is \$473,195. . . The Board reviewed the Management Audit Letter together with the year-end audited statement. The 1990 audited report is available for member's review in the Manager's office.

Manager's Report: The public hearing on the beach erosion project was scheduled for May 31. If no objections were made, and with variance approval, we can then apply for SMA permit, rebid and return to the Board for additional funding if required. . . . The Board approved a second computer ter-

The Board ap-Athletic Report: proved \$1,500 to support the Boys 12 volleyball team. However, prior to any additional funding for the Boys 12 or 14 volleyball teams, the Volleyball Committee must submit to the Board a plan for a program for the Junior 12's and 14's in the State of Hawaii. . . The Board approved \$14,200 in budgeted funds be allocated to the USVBA Junior Tournament. . . The Board emphasized that the Volleyball Committee is responsible for arrangements to monitor security during the open tournaments using Club employees. The committee was also asked to report on how security is controlled and monitored during the open volleyball tournaments.

The Board approved \$960 in airfare to send the water polo team to the Maui Invitational Tournament . . . Received a letter from the Waikoloa Canoe Club thanking the Club for the use of our canoe.

Building & Grounds Report: The Board approved \$4,250 in improvements to the Women's Locker Room and to complete work in the Junior Boy's Locker Room.

House Report: A House Committee recommendation that a dues increase is in order, was forwarded to the Long Range Planning Committee. Management was asked to prepare projections and a cash flow report for the next Board meeting.

Public Relations Report: The committee is preparing a strategy for dealing with the news media in a crisis and a strategy for improving the Club's public image.

Historical Report: \$500 was approved to purchase books for the Historical Committee.

Club Security Report: After reviewing the report, the Board recommended that three members from B&G and three members from House Committee, together with the Manager, meet as a subcommittee to analyze and modify the report and forward recommendations to the Board.

Coast Guard Foundation: The Board approved a contribution of \$200 to the Coast Guard Foundation.

Special Membership: The Executive Committee recommended a policy on special memberships be adopted by the Board. Special memberships would be granted subject to 1) application being processed during the duration of the requested special membership time frame and 2) payment of initiation fee for class of membership for which they are applying. A Bylaw change would be necessary.

Boat Decal: The manager will be sending out a letter to all members with a boat/kayak outlining decal requirement that will be in effect in June. There will be a limit of one decal per member.


