

# **An Invitation to a Classic Summer**

Another canoe paddling season is about to launch into summer and all you need to get aboard is a paddle. Chris Kincaid, chairman of the Canoe Racing Committee, has enlisted nine committee members to coordinate the rest of the details.

The committee members, Paula Crabb, Geoff Graf, Kawika Grant, Walter Guild, Genie Kincaid, Tom McTigue, Missy Mowat, Steve Scott and Mary Smolenski, have been drafted to ensure that this season's itinerary is no different from those of summers past. To Chris, this means achieving certain goals for the Club.

"This year, I'd like to see more interest and involvement in the paddling program generated at all age levels," he said.

"I'd also like to see the Club continue to be a factor in perpetuating the sport of canoe racing, and develop a successful program that achieves certain competitive goals, like winning the Macfarlane Regatta, the Oahu and State Championships, and the men's and women's Molokai to Oahu races."

All this and have fun too? Sure, why not.

"When I was a novice, paddling was just plain fun," Chris added. "I looked up to the guys who were in the senior crews and couldn't wait to have a chance to paddle Molokai. I'd like to see that sort of enthusiasm generated and maintained, especially among our new and younger paddlers.

"And above all else, including the winning, I want the people who participate in this program to have fun."

Chris began paddling for Outrigger as a novice in 1983. He paddled in his first Molokai race in 1984, and was on the crew that won the Molokai races in 1986, 1987 and 1988.

"Paddling has been very fulfilling for me. It's taken me to different places and introduced me to good people. Now it's my turn to give something back to paddling."

The canoe racing season consists of two parts. From June to August, it's the regattas or sprint races, and from August to October, the distance races take over.

Outrigger has been successful on both levels, winning five straight OHCRA titles, six straight state championships, five of the last seven Molokai Hoe crossings and two of the last six Na Wahine O Ke Kai races.

To guarantee continued success for Outrigger this regatta season, the committee

Are you a good cook? Does everyone want your recipe for that delicious pupu or casserole you make?

If so, why not submit your favorite recipe to our new monthly column, OCC's Best Chefs. Each month, we'll publish a recipe from one of our members.

Who knows, if we get enough good ones, we may come up with our own Outrigger cookbook some time in the future.

This month, to kick off our column, we're featuring Matt Cabot with his recipe for Crab Soup, which was featured recently in Sunset Magazine's, Chef's of the West column.

If you'd like to submit a recipe for the June issue, just leave it for the Editor at the Front Desk.

#### Crab Soup

- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1 medium-size onion, chopped
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2 quarts low-fat or whole milk
- 1 bottle (8 oz) clam juice

1/2 cup dry sherry

- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire
- 1 pound shelled cooked crab
- 1 hard-cooked egg or 3 hard-cooked egg yolks, rubbed through a fine strainer Salt and pepper



Matt Cabot

Melt butter in a 4- to 5-quart pan over medium heat. Add onion and stir often until golden, 10 to 15 minutes. Smoothly mix cornstarch with about 1/4 cup of the milk, then add mixture along with remaining milk to pan. Stir often until boiling; turn heat to medium-low and add clam juice, sherry, Worcestershire, and crab. Stir gently until hot. Ladle into bowls. Sprinkle egg onto portions and add salt and pepper to taste. Makes about 3 quarts, 8 or 9 servings.

Per serving: 211 calories, 18 grams protein, 8.2 grams fat, 15 grams carbohydrates, 347 mg sodium, 98 mg, cholesterol.


