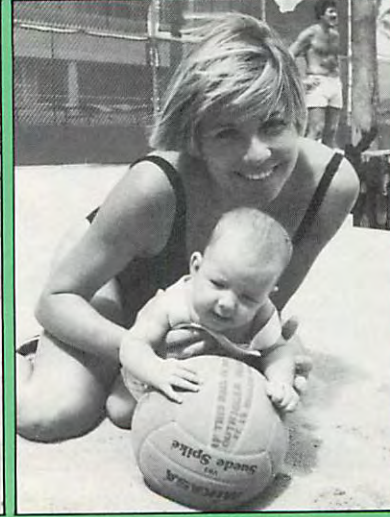
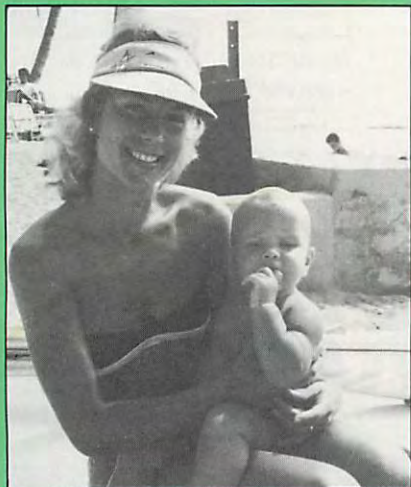

1986 Ocean Triathlon

Bob Rocheleau, a 39-year-old ocean engineer, won the third annual Ocean Triathlon ironman race on March 8 off Sans Souci Beach. The event is sponsored by Outrigger. OCC's Ian Emberson was second, and Tim Guard was third overall and first in the Over 40 Division.

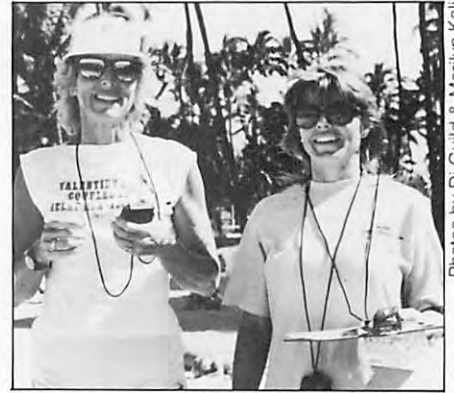
The Triathlon consists of a one-mile swim, two-mile paddleboard race and a four-mile kayak race.

OCC's Marshall Rosa rallied his

team to victory in the team competition in the under-40 relay, while Mike Town kayaked his team to the crown in the over-40 division.

There were a total of nine competitors in the ironman competition, and 14 teams in the relay race.

Following the competition, the Club provided refreshments to all the competitors, and awarded trophies and cash prizes to the winners.

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Master Swimmers Joan and Lloyd Osborne

Put together all the miles Joan and Lloyd Osborne have swum over the past 15 years and they'd be enough to reach from our Outrigger Hau Terrace to the beach at Santa Monica. And back!

Joan and Lloyd are in their 15th year of participation in Masters' Swimming competition, a program designed to provide an incentive for older athletes to continue to keep themselves in shape instead of going to flab.

With age group competition in five-year increments, the aging athlete can look forward with some anticipation to reaching the bottom age in the next higher group, giving him (or her) the opportunity (and the edge) of competing against athletes up to four years older.

Joan sort of backed into the Masters' effort, having swum only briefly at Punahou before being shipped off to a girl's school on the Mainland and then to Tufts College where she earned her BS degree before returning to Hawaii.

Lloyd was a swimmer on championship teams at Yale, captaining the team in his senior year. As a member of the Naval ROTC, he went directly into the Navy upon his graduation in 1932, earning his Navy Wings at Pensacola. After a hiatus because of government cutbacks, Lloyd joined PanAm as a First Officer on their famed Clipper Ships, flying the San Francisco-Hong Kong route. At that time, the San Francisco-Honolulu leg was SIXTEEN HOURS!

The Flying Boats which flew the Pacific were often delayed in Honolulu for as long as three weeks, because of weather, with their crews housed at the Moana Hotel. It was during one of these long layovers in 1937 that Joan and Lloyd met on a blind date. The date turned out to be a songwriter's dream of a romantic setting: tropical isle; full moon; waving palm trees; on the beach where the Marine Corps Air Station is now located.

They were married in 1938.

Having remained in the Naval Reserve, Lloyd was recalled to active duty with the Navy in 1941. He participated in several of the Pacific Island assaults: Saipan, Tinian and Iwo Jima, receiving a number of decorations, including the Bronze Star. He was serving on Admiral Nimitz'

staff at the time of his release from active duty in 1946. He remained in the Reserve program, retiring in 1967 with the rank of Captain.

When Buster Crabbe came to the Islands in 1971 promoting the Masters' Swimming program to encourage over-the-hill swimmers to compete against their age group contemporaries as an inducement to maintain good health, Lloyd was an enthusiastic subject. Joan was somewhat reluctant but joined Lloyd because "it's a lot more fun than doing dishes or running a vacuum cleaner."

Lloyd was an instant success, breaking Masters' records from the start. For Joan it was not so easy. In her first race, a four lap, 100 yard freestyle event, she had difficulty even completing the full distance.

She did the last lap on her back "so I could breathe," she says. "I would have stopped at the end of three laps but there was no ladder at that end of the pool."

Even with that performance, it turned out that her time was only three seconds behind the record for her age group!

Lloyd and Joan now have a string of national records in various age groups going back several years. The Osbornes were the first husband and wife team to be designated All American Masters' Swimmers in the same year.

With Masters' age group competition in five-year increments commencing at

25-29 and going up to 85-90 and then 90 and over, the Osbornes expect to continue competing.

"I have learned," says Joan, "that if we are all designed to live longer, it's a lot more fun to do it feeling well. In order to feel well, you have to be healthy. Swimming helps keep you healthy."

"I'm going to keep on swimming," says Lloyd. "Because of that, I'll be the oldest living graduate of my Yale class of 1932."

Now that our Club has joined U.S. Masters' Swimming, Inc., Lloyd and Joan will be competing for the Outrigger Canoe Club instead of the Humuhumunukunuaapuaa Swim Club, thereby providing a big assist to race announcers.

It is expected that our other fine Outrigger swimmers will join the Osbornes and carry the Club fame throughout the land as its other athletic teams have done.

Following management training, it was off to Hilo as President of Hawaii Electric Light Company. He returned to HECO in

1980 as Vice-President and became President and Chief Operating Officer of HECO in 1985 and is a Vice-President for its holding company as well.

Dan Williamson also boasts a successful family life with wife Nancy, who's a retired Punahou School teacher, and daughter Julie (Freshman at Boulder) and Binney (John Hopkins Medical School). Williamson has served on the Building & Grounds Committee three different times and chaired it in 1984. Major successes therein included refurbishing the Boardroom and Dining Rooms A & B.

Outrigger's Golden Masters volleyball team won the masters division title at the 28th Haili Easter Week Volleyball Tournament in Hilo on March 29.

The Golden Masters team, which is the defending U.S. Volleyball Association champion, came from behind to defeat HGEA, 8-10, 12-10 and 15-10 to capture the title.

OCC's AA team defeated the OCC Masters team in the semi-finals of the AA bracket to advance into the finals against Lokahi. In the championship game, Outrigger defeated Lokahi in the first game, 15-8, and then lost to the defending champions, 15-10 and 14-10. OCC was ahead 6-3 in the third game and was trying for a sudden-death game when Lokahi made 11 consecutive points to win the title.

The Haili tournament is the state's biggest volleyball event and drew 107 entries in this year's competition.

OCC also fielded teams in the A and Women's Divisions.

outstanding player in the master's division. Tom Haine was the most valuable player. Named to the all-star team were Fred Hiapo and Linsley Hotz.

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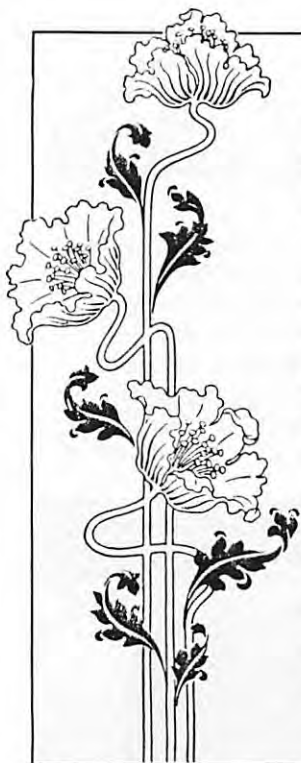
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Luncheon Fashion Show

RULE OF THE MONTH


Parking

Cars of members (except NR-B and NR-C Members) must bear a current Outrigger Canoe Club parking decal in the prescribed manner. Decals and instructions are available to authorized members from the receptionist at the Front Desk.

Nonresident B and C Members must show their current Club identification card to attendants and sign a chit for the posted rate (6 a.m. to 5 p.m. After 5 p.m. no charge).

For other cars without a current parking decal, including cars of authorized guests, limited parking is available at the posted rate (by chit) from 6 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, except Saturday, Sunday, and holidays. There is no charge for parking after 5 p.m. Avoid dinging cars parked beside yours.

Reservations for guest parking are required in advance by the host member contacting the receptionist or the parking attendant and accepting responsibility for the charge. Overnight parking is not permitted without prior explicit permission of the General Manager. Safety regulations are posted in the garage. Violators will be denied Club parking privileges. Parking attendants are required to report the license numbers of cars ignoring stop signs and other safety regulations. Pedestrians have the right of way.

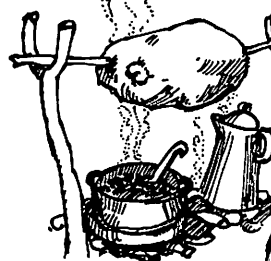
