

The OCC Open Ocean Swim was made up of a short course, approximately 2,000 meters, for those 50 and over, and a long course of 3,500 meters for everyone else.

peated visits to their favorite local dining spot—the OCC dining room!...



# **OCC Team Tackles Maunakea 200**

Outrigger took third place at this year's Maunakea 200 Enduro motorcycle race. on the Memorial Day weekend. OCC motorcycle team participants were Walter Guild, Brant Ackerman, Doss Tannehill, John Beaumont, Steve Ouinn and Mike Haxton, who travelled

to Hilo for two days of rugged endurance riding around Mauna Kea and through the Hilo forests. None of the participants knew the trails they were going to be riding, which made the race very exciting and difficult. The overall performance by OCC riders was the best ever and the prospects of future success looks even better with the "Young Lions" on the horizon.

This year's participants began training last October. On almost any Saturday, the Club team would meet at Kenny's Coffee House in Kalihi at 7 a.m. and head for the hills for a day of fun in the dirt and mud. Before Mauna Kea, most had competed in the Milliani "Hare and Hound" and were entered in the Kahuku four-hour enduro. By Memorial Day they were ready for the big one.

The race course took some 70 riders around the back side of Mauna Kea on Saturday morning, then down into the rough lava before a lunch break at the Girl Scout Camp off the Saddle Road at about the 7,000-foot level. Then the course went back around the top, through the clouds, and dropped down into the Hilo outskirts, covering 117

miles in about six hours.

from shore to surf and back, making it a short but sweet sprint for the contestants.




