After the first few races, nobody really cared who was winning the 70th Annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta on the 4th of July. Paddlers were having so much fun in the First Break south swell that broke across Mamala Bay from Honolulu Harbor to Tonggs, that they will be telling their personal war stories of the event for years to come.

It was the biggest surf on Macfarlane Regatta day since the 1969 Macfarlane which was also First Break, according to Men's Head Coach Steve Scott. "I remember steering the Junior men that year. We caught the wave of the day (eight feet) and for a second it looked as though we had it all the way in, but we got jammed by a surfboard and that ended it, we had the wipe out of the day. We were in a tube with no place to go. We were determined to finish and bailed and bailed and came in fourth place." A total of 30 canoes swamped that year.

1980 was another year of big surf and Scott again steered the Junior men in seven-foot surf. "I was steering the Kakina that year and I remember being at the bottom of the wave, and turning. Before I knew it we were airborne and everyone jumped out. We got back in, bailed and finished the race."

This year bragging rights go to the Men 55 who finished their half-mile race totally submerged. On their way to the finish line, with no other canoes in sight, waves began breaking over them.

"We were in lane seven. We didn't hit any waves going out," recalls Doug Ostrem, "we didn't even have to bail on the way out. We caught a wave and were coming back in. Half way in from the quarter mile flag we got caught by one wave after another. I couldn't stay in my seat.

"We were going to bail out of the boat, but our steersman Al Van Gieson told us to stay put and start padwe did. We kept getting lower and lower in the water."

OCC finished in 4:30.27, while Hui Nalu crossed the line in 5:30.75 and Keahiakahoe was third in 8:21.16. The other three boats in the race huli'd or got swamped and were DQ'd.

Rich Ray's adrenaline was pumping after the race. It wasn't just the thrill of the finish, but the excitement of winning his first Macfarlane Regatta race since he was a

"I bailed more than I paddled," Senior crew paddler Scott Gamble said.

"We were swamped paddling out and we took on water coming back in. It never stopped," said Junior crew member Pam Davis. "All I did was bail." At one time the water was up to her knees, she added.

Steersman Todd Bradley reported that waves were breaking with six to seven foot faces during the youth races at the quarter-mile flag where those races begin. "These huge waves were breaking as we were trying to get to the starting line and get in position. It took forever to get all the boats lined up because the waves were breaking on us."

As the tide started coming up in the afternoon the sets got bigger. The lulls between sets were almost nonexistent.

This year, the safety crew on jet skis attached ropes to the canoes that huli'd and towed them into shore. After some particularly large sets, the jet skis collected all the bailers that had washed out of boats and returned them to the clubs that were missing them.

A total of 34 crews were DQ'd during the day, most for a huli or swamping, but a few for finishing in the wrong lane when the steersman couldn't correct course at

Outrigger changed canoes during the regatta, between the fiberglass *Henry Keawe Ayau* and the *Kekio* whenever one swamped or huli'd, so the next crew could get out to the starting line expeditiously, while the other canoe was being emptied.

Steersmen had the difficult job of finding a way to get through the surf on the way out, and then staying on the wave on the way in. Despite their best efforts, many canoes slid sideways on the waves, and there were lots of huli and swamps and near misses.

"No lane was a sweet lane," said steersman Jimmy Austin. "Some were luckier than others, but surf was breaking in every lane, all day long."

Outrigger is lucky to have so many able steersmen to steer our canoes safely through the surf. Our thanks to Marc Haine, Jimmy Austin, Karel Tresnak Jr., Danny Sheard, Todd Bradley, Jim Beaton, Billy Balding, Kisi Haine, Mike Lum and Alfred Van Gieson for guiding us through the surf and helping make this such a memorable day.

Although First Break accounted for a lot of the wave action, paddlers were also wondering how much the Waikiki Beach Dredging Project in April changed the Bay. There was a lot more sand in the water, making it shallower near shore. The beach sand was also different than in the past. It was grayer than the old Waikiki sand, and seemed much firmer than the old beach, almost cementlike. There was also a lot of dredged coral that washed up during high tide.

Fortunately, there were no serious injuries or major damage to canoes, although there were several broken ama and iako, including Outrigger's iako.

For the record, Lanikai racked up 98 points to win the

AAA division and drank champagne out of the Matson Trophy for winning the Senior Men's race. The Healani women drank champagne from the Senior Women's Bowl.

The beautiful sunny day started with a paddler's breakfast at the OCC, followed by a pep rally in the Ka Mo`i Lounge led by Club President Marc Haine and Walter Guild. Walt explained the history of the race which is named for his uncle Walter J. Macfarlane.

The opening ceremonies were held on the beach. Emcee Mike Buck introduced Manu Boyd and Leinaala Heine Kalama who gave the pule and chant. When we first arrived at the beach, the waves weren't too big, but once Leinaala got through asking for waves in Hawaiian, up they came. Les Ceballos sang *Hawaii Pono'i*. Chloe Saracco, a member of the OCC Girls 13 crew, got huge applause for her rendition of the *Star Spangled Banner*.

After the regatta, paddlers and their families headed back to the Club for the annual party which featured a Steak Fry and entertainment by the Jeff Rasmussen Band and Ooklah the Moc. Dancing and fireworks from Ala Moana Beach wound up the night.

Paddlers will compete in the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association State championships on Saturday, August 4 at Ke'ehi Lagoon. Distance racing gets underway later this month, with Outrigger hosting the Dad Center race for women on Sunday, August 26. The race is from Kailua Beach Park to the OCC Beach.

Over the next 30 years, as we approach the 100th Macfarlane anniversary, we look forward to hearing more war stories of First Break, huge sets, unbelievable finishes, and miraculous survivals.

Here's to the "remember whens" and "bragging rights".






29 Years Ago President Benjamin B. Cassiday Jr.







Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting on June 28, 2012.

The Board is continuing to discuss the future of this investment with a planned informational meeting for the membership at a date to be determined. The Board discussed the Kalanianaole property's expenses effect on the Building Fund.


Financial Statement: Ending Net Operating Fund Income for the month was \$60,214. There was a combined Food & Beverage net income, with the minicharge, of \$8,220




