It was a mellow 74th Annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta on the 4th of July but it had its highs and lows beginning with the tides that greeted paddlers. There was a minus tide when the races started with lanes 6 and 7 having to contend with a sandbar that was too shallow for canoes to cross. By midafternoon the tide was super high at 2+ feet and that left little beach for canoes, tents and people.

The surf was a fun 1-3 feet with many crews catching waves which excited the thousands watching from shore, especially with the many near photo finishes.

But the most excitement came just before the last race of the day. Outrigger head coach Guy Wilding told paddlers that Lanikai was only one point ahead of OCC in the standings, and a win would give us the regatta. The race announcer repeated several times that the result would decide the regatta.

The OCC Mixed Open crew threw their hearts and souls into the race and edged Lanikai at the finish flag by 24/100 of a second to get what everyone thought was the team victory that would have been Outrigger's first since 2013.

Outrigger's Senior Women won the right to sip champagne out of the Senior Women's Cup by beating Healani by 37 seconds in their 1.5 mile race.

Outrigger's Senior Men got to sip champagne too, but it was as runners up to Lanikai which finished five seconds ahead of them.

After a slow start in the morning, Outrigger dominated the second half of the regatta winning 12 of the last 23 races, finishing second in three, third in three and fourth in two. Congratulations to the Sophomore Women, Junior Men, Senior Women, Men 70, Men and Women 65, Men and Women 60, Men 55, Men 50, Women Open 4 and the Mixed Open crews for their wins.

Four Outrigger crews will get their names on the Macfarlane perpetual trophies: the Senior Women's Cup, the Girls 18 Cup, the Girls 12 Trophy and the Ke Ka Wa'a Kahiko (Men 70).

The Girls 16 set a new course record for their event.

Reciprocal Club Review

The newest addition to our OCC Reciprocal Club roster is a prestigious club located in the heart of midtown Manhattan. The club was founded in 1896 by a group of University of Pennsylvania alumni in NY-the first alumni group formed outside of Philadelphia. In 1900 they secured a suite of rooms in the "middle of the city-adjacent to a café" at the Royalton Hotel.

The club then moved to larger quarters in the Hotel Stanley. In 1922 the club's directors approved a 20 year lease on two townhouses at 35-37 East 50th Street. By 1929 the club had more than 1000 members and was looking for a permanent home. But it would be three decades before they got their permanent home at 30 W 44th Street, where they remain today.

The club is only three blocks from Grand Central Station and is close to Times Square, the Broadway Theater District, and major shopping. To add to the convenient location the club has 39 guest rooms. These rooms occupy six floors and have both standard and deluxe categories with twin, queen, or king size beds.

Accommodations include complimentary access to the Palestra Fitness Center and Terrace, plus complimentary breakfast in the Grill Room on weekends. All rooms have fax/ modem ports along with complimentary high speed internet connection. Laundry/dry cleaning and shoe shine service is also available to overnight guests. The Palestra Fitness Center has full state of the art equipment and also offers a variety of massages.

Dining consists of two areas. The main dining rooms – there are two and they are double story on the second floor providing excellent cuisine in a grand manner. They serve breakfast, lunch and dinner Monday-Friday. With special pretheater dining. Then the Grill Room on the lower level also serves, lunch, dinner and cocktails Monday-Friday. noon-11 p.m. On Saturdays they serve continental breakfast and lunch and drinks up until 7 p.m. On Sundays and holidays they're open only for continental breakfast.

You can stay connected to the internet while there. The Kite and Key Bar in the Franklin Living Room on the first floor has morning complimentary coffee with a bar open from 4-7 p.m. Monday-Friday.

So, if you're heading to the Big Apple to see Tony-award winning "Hamilton" or other Broadway shows consider staying at The Penn Club and/or trying their pre-theater dining. If you're staying in their guest rooms they have a Concierge who may be able to help you get theater tickets. Check with JoAnne Huber in our executive office about setting up a required letter of introduction. Credit cards are accepted for payments.





BOARD BRIEFS

Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Directors on June 30, 2016.

Admissions: The Board would like an increase in the number of Regular member and Nonresident candidates interviewed in the A & M meetings since initiation fees have a direct impact on the Building Fund.

Membership Count: The membership count was 4,843 as of May 31, 2016.

Committees: Mark Jackola was approved to serve on the Paddleboard Committee; Brendan Bradley on the Fishing and Boating Committee; and Ben Ancheta and Keely Bruns on the Member Relations Committee.

Treasurer's Report: Club operations are ahead of budget by \$74,000. Food and Beverage financials have been very strong year to date.

General Manager's Report: Costs and payroll have been in line for Food & Beverage which is contributing to the great financial results. . . Fred Noa complimented Gary Oliveira for the great job he has been doing in getting F & B service and quality improved and costs in line over the last four years. . . There was a brief discussion about the differences between Koa Lanai and Hau Terrace and controlling overflow on the Hau Terrace. Kitchen limitations restrict the number of people the Terrace can handle during peak times. . . The Club is basically operating at capacity many evenings. . . The Board discussed peak periods and perceived overcrowding of the Club. Gary Oliveira pointed out that though there is an increase in Reciprocal members during the summer and holidays, there are even more OCC member-sponsored guests during these periods. We also have a large percentage of Nonresident members who visit the Club during peak periods. . . There was also a discussion of the parking lot being full due to members parking at the Club for Aquarium, Zoo, and Shell events during the summer. Paddling practice also adds to the summer parking crunch. . . Sous Chef Lucy Han will be leaving to take a chef position at a new restaurant. . . HIHR is taking over personnel and payroll functions for the Club.

Finance: The committee will be formulating a charter for the Financial Committee.

Long Range Planning: The new chairs have been evaluated and selected for the remodeling project. Tables and other pieces should be selected soon. . . Dues distribution among member types is being studied for possible revenue neutral options.

Senior 'Riggers: Fred Noa reported to the Board on the progress of a new Senior 'Riggers group that is organizing to create activities for Senior OCC members during mornings and weekdays. The Board and management are supportive of this proposal.

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
