
## Be a Good Neighbor

#### A Letter to You Re Guests

November 1, 1945

Dear Sir:

We are trying to make the Club a more enjoyable place for you and the other members by correcting abuses of our hospitality. In order to stop unauthorized use of the facilities it will be necessary for the staff to question the presence of certain people on the grounds and in the dining room from time to time.

In order to avoid a chance of embarrassment to your friends who are not members of the Club, we ask that you adhere to the rules of the Club regarding guest privileges. These rules are:

Guest cards will be issued at a charge of \$1.00
each to guests for one week upon application
by members in good standing.

2. A member in good standing may bring guests

to the Club, but must accompany them and register them at the lobby. This applies also to wives, husbands, and children of members who are not members of the Club. A guest may not visit the Club oftener than twice per month.

The Directors have instructed the Manager to deviate from the twice-per-month rule in the case of families and to allow members to bring their families to the dining room for meals and drinks oftener, provided they are always accompanied by a member. This privilege, however, does not include the use of the locker room facilities. A charge of 25c is imposed on each guest using the locker room and Rule No. 2 must be abided by all guests.

With your cooperation, we hope to continue this

liberal interpretation of the rules.

# Proper Apparel in Dining Lounge
