The following resolutions were unanimously approved at the Special Meeting of Members held Friday, November 30, 1962.

I. RESOLVED, that the action of the Board of Directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club in authorizing the execution of a contract for additional dredging of a swimming and boating area in front of the new club (Diamond Head) site and for the additional construction and development of a beach in front of this site be hereby approved, ratified and confirmed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proper officers of the Club be authorized to enter into any additional contract or contracts necessary for this purpose; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Club's Board of Directors is also authorized and empowered to expend additional funds for this purpose, which additional funds shall not exceed \$25,000.00 so that the total amount to be expended on this dredging and beach development project shall not in any event exceed \$55,000.00

II. RESOLVED, that the action taken by the Board of Directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club in authorizing the elimination of club residential units from the proposed development of the new club (Diamond Head) site and proceeding with the development of the new club (Diamond Head) site and proceeding with the development of club and parking facilities only be hereby approved, ratified and confirmed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the action taken by the Board of Directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club in authorizing the execution by the proper officers of the Club of a contract with the architects for the preparation of plans for such club and parking facilities only, eliminating the club residential units, is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.

III. RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to expend a sum not to exceed \$1,250,000 for architectural fees, construction, landscaping, furniture, equipment and contingencies in connection with the new club and parking facilities at the new club (Diamond Head) site; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Outrigger Canoe Club be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to borrow such funds as may be necessary to meet the difference between the amount in the club's building fund and the cost of the architectural fees, construction, landscaping, furniture, equipment and contingencies in connection with the new club and parking facilities at the new club (Diamond Head) site, provided that the total cost of such architectural fees, construction, landscaping, furniture, equipment and contingencies shall not exceed the sum of \$1,250,000.00.

A scale model is on view in the Club's lobby and all members are invited to take a look at this concept of their future new clubhouse.
