NEW CLUB DEVELOPMENT

The preliminary plans of the new club were completed on October 15, two weeks past the dead line set in May and as reported in previous Forecasts. The Board of Directors has approved the preliminaries and directed the Planning Committee and architects to proceed with working drawings and a model. It is hoped that a special membership meeting will be called late in November in order to apprise the members of the plans.

At this point the general design and theme have been established. From now on most of the planning has to do with details of arrangement of equipment, furniture, lockers, etc. The way things are progressing, it appears certain that we will be back on schedule shortly and that construction can commence on or before March 1, 1963.

The second phase of the beach development is under way by Hawaiian Dredging & Construction Co., Ltd. Involved in this phase are removal of objectionable coral deposits from the Sans Souci beach, construction of a groin, additional dredging to increase the area of the swimming basin, and shaping and compacting of the coral base for future beach. The estimated date of completion is December 7, 1962. The third and final phase will commence shortly thereafter. This will be the excavation for the new building and utilization of the excavated sand for the new beach. Borings at the site disclose excellent material available for beach use.
