Ray Cain, a 28 handicapper at Oahu Country Club, managed a birdie and three pars to grab the B Group trophy with a net 64.

The High Gross trophy went to Barbara McGuire at 117.

Haynie won the closest-to-the-pin trophy while Jack Maguire won longest drive honors with a hit that was so long that it was beyond the SECOND shots of most of the players.

Although only eight women participated in the tournament, it is planned to have a separate Ladies Division for the Fall Championship, now scheduled for September.
