Paddleboard Racers Set New Records in the 2nd Annual Winter Race

On Sunday, December 30, 1979, twenty-two strong-armed paddleboard racers started from Outrigger Beach on the 10,000-meter grind laid out by our Club's own paddleboard enthusiasts. Weather and ocean conditions were ideal and the paddlers took advantage of both to roll up a few new records.

Bret Goodfriend, winner of last summer's paddleboard race, kept up the good work, paddling off with both overall and men's top honors in new record time of 1:15.02, beating Chuck Kelley's time by 2 minutes.

Boy's winner, and 5th overall, was Pat Caldwell. His time of 1:24.54 broke his own record of 1:31.15, set in the 1978 winter race.

Women's winner was Kisi Haine in the record time of 1:56.40, beating her own record of 1:58.12 set in the 1979 summer race.

Following the race, awards were presented at the Club to the first three finishers. On display during the beer, soda and sandwiches feed was the new Perpetual Paddleboard Trophy, which will have the names of all division winners inscribed on it.

Announcing CPR Classes

The Outrigger Canoe Club, in cooperation with the American Red Cross, will offer basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) classes to our membership, starting early in March.

The first two classes will be held on Monday evenings, March 3rd and 10th, in the Club's Board Room. Class time for the basic course is four hours, from 6 to 10 p.m.

The Green Flash

A green coloration of the upper portion of the sun, caused by atmospheric refraction and occasionally seen as the sun rises above or sinks below the horizon, is called the "Green Flash". It is generally seen over large bodies of water or desert areas where the view is not obstructed by clouds or impurities in the air.

For OCC members and their guests, the Green Flash may be seen from the Hau Terrace at this time of the year when the sun is setting and the air is clear, with no clouds on the horizon between the viewer and the sun.

You are doubtless familiar with the seven colors of the spectrum: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. As the sun sets, the lower red rays have sunk below the observer's horizon. Orange and yellow are largely absorbed by the atmosphere. Blue and violet rays are scattered by dust particles in the air, leaving GREEN. Thus, the Green Flash.

Warning: avoid staring at the setting sun while awaiting the Green Flash. Instead, watch the sun "out of the corner of your eye" until it is ready to go below the horizon; then watch for the Green Flash. (It takes a camera with a 200 to 1 focal length to catch the phenomenon.)

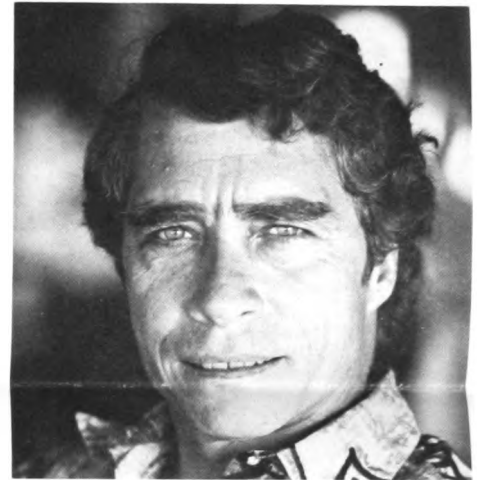
PRESIDENT'S REPORT - FEBRUARY, 1980

The big news this month is the appointment of Mr. RAYMOND LUDWIG as our General Manager. . . his story appears elsewhere in this issue. Mr. Ludwig was selected over some stiff competition and the Board gave him their full endorsement and support.

In the January issue of Honolulu magazine I read an article which pointed out the dinner increases that have taken place in a number of our local restaurants between 1976 and late 1979. I met with Mr. Ludwig and we compared the dinner increases quoted in the article with our own dinners here at the Club for the same time period. In general the various restaurants referred to in the Honolulu magazine story increased prices an average of 83% with one restaurant increasing their dinner prices 138%! Meanwhile we have shown an average increase for the same dinners of **only 29%**.

At our December Board meeting Mr. Richard Coons of the House Committee and a local partner of Touche Ross accounting firm met with us and brought us up to date with various IRS regulations that govern our operation. It is comforting to have this type of professionalism on our House Committee to keep us current. We also had another professional meet with us at the December meeting. . . Mr. Nikolaus Klotz of our Food and Beverage Committee and General Manager of the Hawaiian Regent. . . Third Floor, etc. Mr. Klotz reviewed our food and beverage operations for the past year and it appears we are in excellent shape.

Now that we have our manager and controller, our next challenge that should be resolved is our computer system, followed by the kitchen and storage expansion. . . then solar heating.

Tho our parking during these winter months is not a major problem, we have nevertheless, instructed management to make some adjustments in our canoe repair area that will give us a few more parking spaces. Meanwhile our Long Range Planning Committee continues to wrestle with the many facets of our parking problems and solutions.

Here is one of those little steps we took to make your life here at the Club more comfortable. I recently was reading a book written by one of our members - "The Skin You Live In", by Doctor Norman Goldstein. In the book he writes: "Sunburn is due to a temporary condition known as **photosynthesis**. Photosynthesis seems to be due to certain substances that are found in food, cosmetics and medicine." Listed as common photosynthesizers are two brands of soap currently used by our Club: Safe-Guard and Dial. I met with Doctor Goldstein and he gave me a list of other soaps that would not cause photosynthesis. We now have these recommended soaps in our locker rooms.
