Club member Harry Huffaker on Thursday, September 14, became the first swimmer in history to swim from Oahu to Molokai.

The 26-mile swim from Makapuu Cove on Oahu to a spot near Ilio Point on Molokai, sponsored by the Outrigger Canoe Club and escorted by four Club members rotating on surfboards, was completed in 16 hours and 15 minutes. Five years ago, Huffaker had made the swim from Molokai to Oahu in 13½ hours.

Club members who escorted the swimming dentist on his history-making swim were: Bruce Ames, Rick Steere, Bob Lundy and Ron Haworth. Haworth also reported the event for the Honolulu Star-Bulletin.

# Jensens do OCC proud in 14th Annual Billfish Tournament

This year's Outrigger Canoe Club representatives in the 14th Annual Billfish Tournament at Kailua-Kona, Mardi and Ed Jensen and their son, turned out to be as strong a competitive deep sea fishing team as any club could want.

On Monday, August 7, at 8 a.m., 59 boats manned by fishing teams from all over the world put out to sea to begin one of the most exciting tournaments of the past several years. By 9:30 that morning, Ed Jensen got his first strike . . . a fighting 133-lb. ahi. With good team work, the Jensens had him gaffed within 12 minutes, exceptionally fast time for a big tuna. Thus Ed racked up 266 points in the ahi division for the OCC.

Tuesday was a wipeout; no action. But on Wednesday Mardi Jensen, a veteran deep sea fisherwoman, exhibited her skill by boating a 164-lb. marlin in 23 action-packed minutes,

giving our Club another 328 points to move the OCC into 18th place.

On the fourth day of the meet, the Jensens caught a "his" and "hers" marlin, both on the 50-pound test line which they used exclusively throughout the tournament. The fighting time on each of the big fish—148 and 139 pounds respectively—was 55 minutes, and together they added 574 points to the Club's score.

At the Awards Banquet on Saturday, August 12, the Jensens received individual trophies for the three marlin they had caught, while Mardi Jensen received the award for Highest Individual Woman's Score.

Final official standings showed the Outrigger Club in 5th place in the marlin division—59 teams competing, while Ed Jensen held 4th place in a field of 235 in the ahi division, and Mardi Jensen placed first in the woman's division against a field of 20.

## Advertising in The Outrigger

The recently announced opening of The Outrigger's columns to a limited amount of classified and business card advertising by Outrigger Canoe Club members only is now in its second experimental month. To date the response has not been overwhelming, despite the fact that for the time being, both want ads and business cards are being run **manuahi** — for free. It is the hope of our management that interest will pick up in time.

Advertising in the Club's house organ is no new thing. It was instituted following World War II when the original "Forecast" was launched as the Club's monthly mini-magazine. If there are records of how much revenue the advertising produced, they would hardly be relevant today.

Business cards are relatively easy to handle because of their more or less permanent character. Members must remember, however, that material for such cards should be submitted in the correct size: 2 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 2" deep. Classified ads pose problems because the copy is a month old when the ad appears. This should be remembered when an ad is submitted.

The experiment will be continued for a time. Give it a try.
