Two Awarded The Winged "O"

The 1970-71 Awards Banquet was held on Monday, August 30th in the Club dining room, where more than two hundred members saw their sons and daughters receive recognition for their athletic achievements and participation on behalf of the Outrigger Canoe Club. The entire evening was under the direction of Wally Young, Chairman of the Winged "O" Committee. In attendance on behalf of the Winged "O" Committee were Master of Ceremonies for the banquet, Ron Sorrell, Peter Balding, Cline Mann, Tom Arnott, Mark Buck, and Fred Hemmings, Jr. Away on the mainland were Tom Haine and Jerry Ober.

The Winged "O" Committee, under the guidance of Wally Young, has this year realized the accomplishment of a long range goal, that of standardizing the awards system for the Club.

The standardized system is outlined as follows:

1. The Winged "O", Outstanding Contribution in Athletics.
2. Outstanding Athletic Achievement for national and international honors.
3. Outstanding Athletic Achievement for State and local honors.
4. Outstanding Athletic Achievement for Club and other designated athletic events.
5. Outstanding contribution in support of Outrigger's athletic ideals.
6. Participation in Outrigger Canoe Club sponsored events.

The award plaques were in part designed by Jerry Ober, and personally made by Chairman Wally Young, who devoted many hours of his time to the production of superbly crafted plaques of Hawaiian grown woods. The selected woods used by Wally are: Koa, Golden Koa, Kou, Milo, Monkey Pod, Lychee, and Island Mahogany. Special thanks are due Mr. M. A. Blair for allowing the use of his specialized wood working equipment for the production of the plaques.

Special mention and thanks go to Wally's wife, Mrs. Ernestine Young, who wore out five felt tip pens in the process of hand lettering each of the 324 participation certificates. President Thad Ekstrand may have contracted a bit of writers' cramp, for he had to sign each of the certificates.

Because of the change of date for the Annual Awards Banquet from February to August, this year's Banquet covered both 1970 and 1971's athletic events to date, most particularly canoeing and volleyball. More than 43 hand-made wooden plaques were awarded to individual athletes. The recipients and their participation are as follows:

The certificates and plaques given out Monday night are just small symbols in recognition of what our athletes gave these past seasons. The real reward to each athlete, especially to the Junior whose character is just taking shape, is his personal growth.

Each athlete had a responsibility to the Club, to his teammates, and to himself to show up for practice and events. Everybody is talking about freedom these days; athletics still develops responsibility.

Each athlete had to put his sweat into the Club effort and really learn what work means, and what wonderful things it can do for both body and spirit. 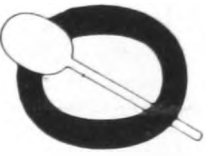

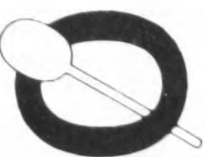
