

NOTICE to non-surfers and old timers . . . those are not "Paipo" (body surfing) boards you see the younger set carrying down to the shore lately. They are "mini-boards" . . . the latest trend in surfboard design ranging from 6 to 9 feet long and weighing between 14 and 18 pounds. With their minimal surface area, narrow tail, and deep fin they have opened new dimensions in performance and techniques. Although much smaller, these boards retail at \$175 to a high of \$200 for the "Lotus" model such as Brant Ackerman owns. If you want to avoid these prices, you might strip down, reshape your present board as Mike Driscoll has done. Or if you are really stoked, you can build your own mini-board from scratch. Ask Tom Bean for expert advice on this method.

California Honolulu Catamaran Race 1968

Plans are rapidly taking shape for the 3rd biennial California-Honolulu Catamaran Race which starts at San Pedro on July 4 and finishes at Diamond Head beginning about July 12. Held under the auspices of Ocean Racing Catamaran Association (ORCA), the race is co-sponsored by Seal Beach Yacht Club of California, which conducts the start, and Outrigger Canoe Club and Waikiki Yacht Club who handle the tasks at the finish.

This year eleven boats are entered, in contrast to five boats in '66 when Patty Cat was 1st to finish and Glass Slipper was winner on corrected time. In addition to these two boats and Imiloa, veteran of the '64 and '66 races, entries include TV star Jim Arness' new 55-ft. Sea Smoke, which from all indications is the favorite to finish first. Another new boat, relatively untested, is owned and skippered by auto racer Lance Reventlow.

It was in 1955 that **Waikiki Surf**, skippered by OCC member **Rich Muirhead**, who has since passed away, sailed along unofficially in the Transpac Race. In 1957

another OCC member, **Kenny Murphy**, skippered his famous **Aikane**, again unofficially, and was first to finish. Eventually ORCA was formed to conduct a special race for multihulls to be held during even-numbered years between the years of the Transpac Race for monohulls,

now 62 years old.

Outrigger Canoe Club was appropriately chosen as a co-sponsor inasmuch as the modern catamaran is a descendent of the ancient Polynesian double and outrigger canoe. Moreover the new OCC location has lent itself to a spectacular and romantic site for the finishing boats to be received in colorful Hawaiian fashion in the lagoon.

After finishing, the boats will be moored at OCC for one night and then taken to Ala Wai Yacht Basin for the remainder of their stay in Hawaii. This arrangement, of course, will be dependent upon favorable surf and wind conditions.

A no-host cocktail party will be held at the Waikiki Yacht Club; the awards banquet will be held at Outrigger

Canoe Club, dates to be announced later.

The executive committee handling the affair on the Honolulu end is headed by Cline Mann. Assisting are Pete Dillingham, currently vice-commodore of Waikiki Yacht Club, Dan Feltham of OCC and WYC and Buck Ashford of Kaneohe Yacht Club. Dan Wallace is handling publicity while Wally Young and Tom Reiner are in charge of towing and mooring at OCC. Lou Schilling will head the information center, the job she had held for 20 years in the Transpac Race. Members are asked to volunteer as assistants to Lou in this most demanding but interesting job. Also, as soon as the list of boats and crews is made available, members will be asked to volunteer as hosts.

President of ORCA this year is Jay Johnson, co-owner of '66 winner, Glass Slipper. Jay is a cousin of OCC member Gordon Dickie and has been a frequent visitor to the club during the past two years.


Marty Wilson, after his highly successful season in basketball for Kalani High, is now a key pitcher for that school's baseball team.
