The Board of Directors, the Outrigger Canoe Club, and I are pleased to announce the 3rd Junior Athletic Summer Program will commence on Wednesday, June 14 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for eight weeks ending Wednesday, August 2, 1967.

Again we are very fortunate to have Dave Pierson as our program director. Dave did an outstanding job last year and we look forward to this program as one of the leading Outrigger events of the year.

Qualifications: Your child must be a member of the Outrigger Canoe Club to participate in this summer program. We are sure you are aware your child, age 10 through 19 years, is exempt from paying an initiation fee until May 17. After this date children of Regular members, age 10 through 13 years, are exempt. This program will give you the opportunity to introduce your son or daughter into the full athletic activities of the club as outlined above, plus a special course in water appreciation.

Cost: The total charge for this 8-week program is \$100 per child, including luncheon and an official Junior Athletic Summer Program shirt. In order to make it easier to enter this program the total fee for each child entered can be charged to your account and split over a 2-month period—June and July at \$50 per month.

Evaluation: Your child will be evaluated at the end of each week; also, at the end of the total program an award system will be in effect recognizing the individual as well as team effort during the program. After daily roll call a program will be given to each child in advance

so that interested parents will know the activities of following days ahead of time.

Naturally there will have to be a limit to the total number of children participating in this summer program. This will be made at a later date in accordance to the response and interest for such an outstanding activity. We enclose an application and ask that you return it to the club as soon as possible. We really expect a tremendous turn-out.

As stated above, Dave Pierson will direct the program and his assistants will be Butch Hemmings, Mark Buck and Thomas Holmes. We anticipate that no more than ten children will be under the direction of a leader. There will also be junior leaders to fill the capacity.
