### VOLLEYBALL

#### Outrigger Team 4th in Nationals

The Outrigger volleyball team returned to Hawaii with 4th place honors, two All-Americans, and the tournament's outstanding player. The National Championships were held in Omaha, Nebraska May 5 — 8; and forty teams vied in the open division in which 4th seeded Westside Jewish Community Center rose from the loser's bracket to win the championship, only the 2nd time in over 35 years that such a feat has been accomplished. The 6th seeded Los Angeles Tigers took second and the top seeded Sand and Sea Club, third. Competition among the top six teams was very keen with anyone capable of winning on a given day.

The outstanding player award went to Outrigger's Pete Velasco, who captained the U. S. team in last year's Tokyo Olympics. Pete was named to the 1st team All-American, and Tom Haine won a berth on the 2nd team. The other players making the trip were player-coach Bob Hogan, Bill Baird, Franklin Brown, Jim Haynes, Mike Holmes, Paul MacLaughlin, Nat Norfleet, Jr., Fred Noa, Ron Sorrell, and manager Wally Young, who took some beautiful movies of the competition which will be shown to members in the near future.

The volleyball team and committee gratefully appreciate the efforts of the Athletic Sponsors Committee and the generous donations from club members which made the trip possible. The reputation of the Outrigger Canoe Club in the athletic field was considerably enhanced. Many of our members perhaps saw the story in the May 17th issue of *Sports Illustrated* and the accompanying picture of the Outrigger's 3-man block consisting of Velasco, Hogan 007, and Haine.

#### Japan Girls Team Exhibition

Honolulu was treated to an outstanding volleyball exhibition on June 2 involving the Nichibo team of Japan, winners of the Women's Volleyball Championship in last year's Tokyo Olympics. Sharing in the spotlight in a men's exhibition before 4,000 spectators in Farrington High School's gym was the Outrigger team which defeated the Hawaii Nationals team made up of predominantly Outrigger members.

#### Sand Tournament Won by Hogan and MacLaughlin

The first sand tournament of the summer season was held over the long Memorial Day weekend with a fine turn-out of twenty two-man teams. Winner was the team of Paul MacLaughlin and Bob Hogan. It took a double finals to oust the runner-ups Tom Haine and Bob Daniels. Finishing third were Bill Heilbron and Jim Haynes.

#### Outrigger to Co-Sponsor *Kamalii* in Trans Pac Race

Sharing the role as sponsor will be the veteran yachtsman Ron Burla.

A large chart in the lobby will show the *Kamalii's* daily position both in Class A and the fleet and estimated date and time of arrival. A large flotilla of the Club's boats, including canoes, surfboards, P-cats, and Sunfish, will provide a colorful reception at the finish line within sight of the club. On Monday July 19 the club and its members will host Larry and his crew and their wives at a cocktail and pupu party, which should prove to be the feature entertainment attraction of the summer.

### Summer Program for Outrigger's Juniors

A new summer program of instruction and supervised activities for young members between the ages of 10 and 17 years has been initiated by the Athletic Committee headed by Club Captain, Cline Mann. The program, which is directed by Nick Beck with the assistance of Steve Fearon and a group of Junior Leaders, involves instruction and frequent competition in the following: water safety, life-saving and first aid; canoeing, including steering, rigging, repair and maintenance; sailing, including rigging, racing rules and tactics, knots, repair and maintenance; volleyball; surfing; surfboard paddling and open water swimming; and other activities in Kapiolani Park.

Bob Casey, well known competitor in the Pacific Catamaran class is a valuable addition to the program as an instructor in both the Sunfish and the P-cat.

The program is limited to Junior and Associate members within the specified age bracket. Non-member children of members will be accepted providing their membership applications are pending.

The ten week program involves six hours of activity per day Monday through Friday and permits easy accommodation for persons with summer school conflicts. The charge for the entire ten weeks is \$25.00.
