


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

NEW CLUB PLANS

Architects are working on the finalizing of the schematic studies and the present tentative time table calls for program and preliminary plans to be completed by the end of September. The membership will then be called upon to approve them and authorize the board to proceed. It will then be the job of the New Club finance committee to solve the financing problems.

It is hoped that satisfactory arrangements can be completed by the end of this year at which time the membership will again be consulted. Assuming approval by the membership, the architects will proceed with working drawings, a job which will carry them to the end of June 1962. The award of a contract will follow and construction will continue through August 1963. It is hoped that furnishings will be completed in time for the club to assume occupancy at least one

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month before the termination of the lease at our present site, October 30, 1963, to insure smooth transition.



However, the boys 15 and under paddling the half mile raced home with first place honors and in doing 50 broke the 1960 record of Kona's Kai Opua crew, lowering it from 4:33.7 to 4:14.4. 

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
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
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
