Very soon a general meeting of Junior Members will be held at which time the complete summer program will be outlined. So watch the bulletin boards for the latest news of your activities.

Amended Junior Member Rules:

1. All Juniors using the Club facilities must submit application for membership upon reaching the age of 10 years.
2. Junior Members are not eligible for guest privileges unless special permission from the Manager is granted for parties, etc.
3. Junior Members are not permitted on Hau Terrace or in bar area unless accompanied by parents.
4. Junior Members must leave club premises by 7:00 P.M. unless approved by the Junior Affairs Committee.
5. Junior Members not permitted in Senior Men's or Women's Locker Rooms at any time unless accompanied by a regular member.
6. Junior Members to confine ball playing to volleyball court; no ball playing on walkways or on the beach.
7. Junior Members who violate the club's rules and regulations or who destroy Club property, deface buildings, act unnecessarily rough or violate good conduct while on Club premises will be disciplined by Junior Affairs Committee. Degree of discipline to be determined by nature of offense and could result in suspension or expulsion from the club. Cooperation of all Club Members and staff in reporting violations to the Junior Affairs Committee will be appreciated.
