PLANNING COMMITTEE

Your Planning Committee is really hard at work and the work will get

harder as time goes on.

A steering committee comprised of Cline Mann, Ward Russell, Hal Whitaker, Wilford Godbold and Link Moore has been formed. This committee is charged with organization of the planning committee, direction and coordination of the various subcommittees, and establishment and maintenance of a time table for the next two and a half years. The committee has begun the task of developing of a program for the architectassociates, Val Ossipoff and Pete Wimberly, to use in preparing preliminary plans and estimates. Three facilities sub-committees will assist in studying and recommending various facilities and area requirements. The club facilities sub-committee is composed of Cliff Melim, Jr., chairman. Barbara Cook, Clarence Philpotts, Don Schmuck, and Ernest Thomas. The athletic facilities sub-committee is composed of Mark Auerbach, chairman, Tom Haine, Ron Sorrell and Aileen Soule. A residence facilities sub-committee has not as yet been complemented, and members willing to serve are urged to leave their names with Jane Lewis, club secretary.

The present tentative time table calls for program and preliminary plans to be completed by the end of June at which time the membership will be called upon to approve the plans and authorize the board to proceed. It will then be the job of the

new club finance committee to solve the financing problems. As reported at the special membership meeting in January, this committee is composed of Tom Singlehurst, Les Hicks, Ed Schneider, Dan Dorman, Bill Curlett. and Buzz Rainalter. It is hoped that satisfactory arrangements can be completed by the end of this year at which time the membership will again be consulted. Assuming approval by the membership, the architects will proceed with working drawings, a joh which will carry them to the end of June 1962. The award of a contract will follow and construction will continue through August 1963. It is hoped that furnishings will be completed in time for the club to assume occupancy at least one month before the termination of the lease at our present site, October 30, 1963, to insure smooth transition.

The beach development committee composed of Keith Wallace, chairman, Bob Bush, Jack Cross, Douglas Johnston, and Wakefield Ward will

study this important phase.

The membership will continue to be appraised of all developments each month through the Forecast Meanwhile all members with observations, comments, or suggestions should contact a board member or Miss Jane Lewis.

OCC WINNERS OF STATE CHAMPIONSHIP


