Hawaii's top men's and women's tennis singles players will be permanently celebrated in brass when the completed koa wood and brass trophy comes out of the shop of master carver Chris Sorenson. Designed by Jon Haig and illustrated here by Frank Hajek, the trophy "tells it like it is"... Hawaii State (symbolized by the state flag in the racquet), Tennis (racquet), Championship (inscribed on face), at Diamond Head (profile in carved wood).
