

Late Tennis News and Notes

Following are excerpts from news items turned in by the Tennis Committee after copy for the April "Outrigger" had gone to the printer:

An Outrigger Club tennis clinic with Gil Rodrigues as clinic pro is teaching beginning classes at Hawaii Kai Recreation Center on Saturday mornings. Classes will run for 10 consecutive weeks. Fees: adults, \$4 per hour; children, \$3 per hour. Classes limited to 6 to 8. Enroll at OCC office.

Outrigger tennis players are now entered in Honolulu's B-C League Tourney, with women competing against men in both singles and doubles. Don Moore, Ann Burke, John Moore and Dave Pierson are team captains.

New tennis ladder rules are now in effect, permitting any player to challenge any other player regardless of current "ladder" position. Challenges may be made in writing, by phone or in person. The new rule will be in effect for two months, according to the news item, which was dated March 9. A new ladder will then be made up, based on results of the challenge matches.
