David Doty had orthoscopic surgery on his knee six weeks before the event and had a personal best during the race. This was David's last Tinman for a while until his lovely support crew Hannah Lowery Doty returns from graduate school.

Some weren't as lucky as David. Albert Lemes trained all year for this one event and just one week before, he severely sprained his ankle.

Brian Deer, in his first race, missed the turn at Hawaii Kai, otherwise his time would have been much better.

While many members set their sights on just finishing, others such as Missy Mowat (15-19 open women), Matt Kresser (20-24 open men) and Keoni Kino (20-24 open men) excelled.

Each one of these fine athletes proved to themselves during the various transitions that you have to dig deep to perform if you want to meet high standards of competition. It's tough in the pits.

I remember yelling to Quentin Kawananakoa to push to the maximum. His slightly garbled voice replied, "I'm burnt." Not really Quentin, you still had to paddle at Kaneohe.

The race started at 5:45 a.m. at Ala Moana Beach Park and ended at Kapiolani Park with approximately 1,100 participants. It included an 800-meter swim, 25-mile bike ride (to Hawaii Kai and back) and 10-kilometer run (around Diamond Head).

Missy finished the swim in fourth place (11:12) overall, and was the first woman out of the water. She finished the Tinman seventh overall in the women's division.

Nicole Wilcox won the 15-19 age division in 2:19.33 and new Jr. 'Rigger Malia Richmond was third in 2:26.42.

The outstanding performance by a member was Matt Kresser, who finished in 1:52.14. He was 11th overall and second in his age bracket, 20-24.
