OCC Softball Finishes Biggest Season Yet

Coach Archie Kaaua's Outrigger softball team finished the 1980 season with a combined slo-pitch and mountainball record of 20 wins and 13 losses. Twenty-one players batted at least 10 times with several other member/ players aiding the team whenever needed.

Season-long plaudits go especially to Bill Kilcoyne, whose combined batting average of .535 included 16 doubles, 5 triples, 8 homers and 43 RBIs. Kilcoyne and Mike Ciacci also patrolled the outfield with sensational plays game after game. Mark Kallenberger hit a sparkling .537 in 54 at-bats, which was not enough to win the title compared to Kilcoyne's 99 at-bats, but a fine achievement.

Danny West, revived after a midseason slump, led the team in home runs with 9 and RBIs with 44.

The Surveyors Mountainball League title maintains its seemingly permanent residence in the Outrigger trophy case as the team ripped through the league with a 13-1 record. Dave Pierson led the hitting with a .667 mark followed by Kallenberger at .606 and Ciacci at .565. West's 5 homeruns and 26 RBIs were tops.

Entering the tough Restaurant Open League was a big challenge to our team. We finished with a disappointing 6-10 record, however we are the only team in the league whose roster is open only to members. Dave Shoji, coach of the national champion U.H. Wahine Volleyball Team, led in the hitting at .543 with Kilcoyne right behind at .522. Games are all played at the Elks Field across from the Outrigger, with mountainball on weekdays and slo-pitch on weekends.

The team plans to expand in 1981 and is looking for interested members to participate. We are also considering entering the Restaurant Coed League, which is a low-pressure, fun league. Interested OCC members should contact any team member. The 1981 season practices begin in March.
