## Spring Cleaning at Dad's Rock

Marc Haine donated several large pieces of carpet to cover the sand and rocks.

The younger members of the clean-up crew thought the Ala Wai site was merely the venue for our canoe racing practices. But some of the senior members of the group remembered the site was also a memorial to "all the dads who come with their kids to enjoy the Ala Wai."

More than two decades ago the landscaping, the sand and the prominent Dad's Rock, were a labor of love, donated to the paddlers of Outrigger Canoe Club by a young man in memory of his father, an engineer who died in a tragic industrial accident in 1983.

Like so many fathers, Fred spent many hours standing on the spot occupied by that conspicuous rock, proudly watching his son Matthew, paddle with his characteristic enthusiasm, up and down the canal.

Now, more than 20 years after dedicating this wonderful memorial to his father and the sport he loves, Fred's son will lead the Outrigger Canoe Club through the 2006 regatta season as our Head Coach.
