

Outrigger Paddlers Rev Up for Macfarlane Regatta

Outrigger Canoe Club paddlers are having a wonderful regatta season this year, and looking forward to the 4th of July Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach.

With more than 300 paddlers registered, the Club performed extremely well in the first three regattas of the season, finishing a close second to Kailua Canoe Club in the Paia Regatta on June 3 at Keahi Lagoon, to Lanikai Canoe Club in the Kamehameha Day Regatta at Kailua Beach on June 10, and to Lanikai in the Leeward Regatta June 17 at Nanakuli Beach Park.

In the opening regatta of the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association season, OCC finished four points out of first place.

"We had an amazing first regatta," said head coach Kehau Kali. "Outrigger was out in force and surprised quite a few people. Twenty-five crews scored points to help Outrigger gather a total of 67 points."

"If we continue to improve," Kali added, "we'll be a real threat at state's this year in Hanalei."

"I'd really like to thank Bill Danford for his efforts in rebuilding the men's program. The men are out in force this year, and filling every crew. Bill has done a great job of recruiting recent college graduates. These crews have a tremendous potential and we look forward to them winning many races for the Outrigger in the future."

Outrigger had to scratch three races in the Paia Regatta in which there were not enough paddlers, and two winning crews were disqualified.

This was the best showing Outrigger had made in the opening regatta since 1997.

In the Kamehameha Regatta on June 10 at Kailua Beach, Outrigger scored 70 points to Lanikai's 87.

Outrigger paddlers won seven events during an overcast, very windy day at Kailua in which one crew swamped and two races were scratched due to insufficient paddlers. It was a great day for the OCC women who won four of the five upper division women races.

Outrigger won a total of seven events, was second in seven, third in four and fourth in six races.

The Sophomore Men's race was run twice. The first time, a canoe was swamped near the course from a previous race, and when the flag signaled the start of the race, some crews were still behind the starting line waiting for the swamped canoe to be removed. Hui Nalu won the first race with Outrigger second. Following a protest, and several meetings of the OHCRA Rules Committee, the event was rerun. This time Lanikai won and Outrigger was fifth.

On Father's Day at Nanakuli, Outrigger again gave a great showing, finishing two points behind Lanikai, 80-78.

Outrigger's kids stole the show, winning six events the Boys 12, 15 and 16, and the Girls 14, 15 and 18 events. All total, Outrigger won 11 events, was second in six, third in four and fourth in two. There were two scratches, two huli and two DQs.

Paddlers will enter the John D. Kaupiko Regatta on July 15 at Keahi Lagoon. The OHCRA championships will be held on July 22 at Keahi Lagoon. The State Championships are scheduled for Saturday, August 4 at Hanalei Bay, Kauai.

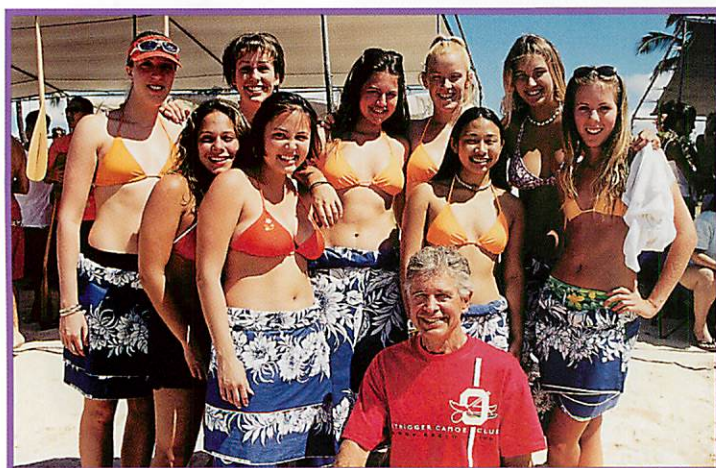

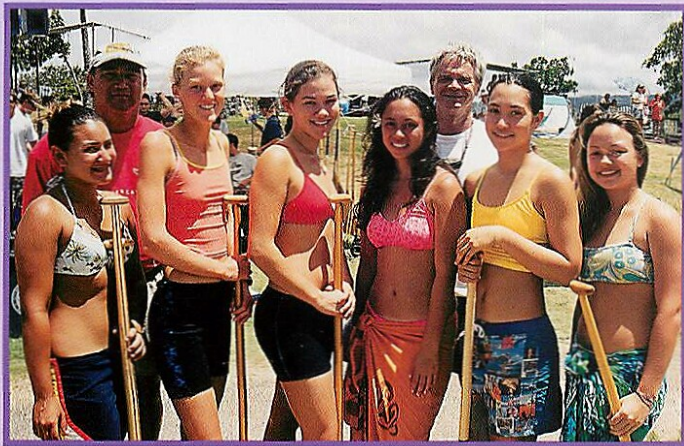

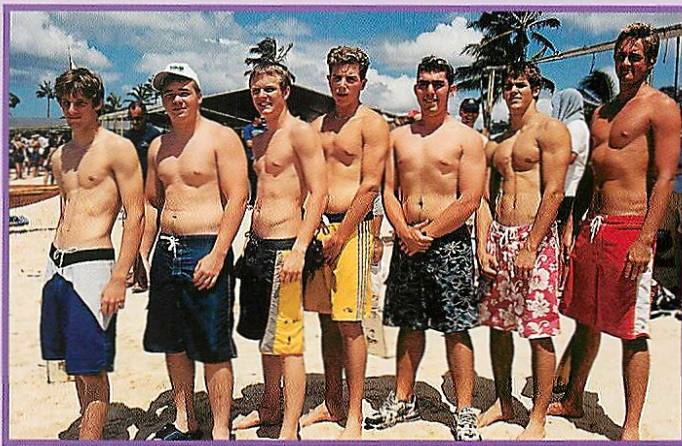
