

PALAMAS FALL FROM TOP PLACE IN BASKET LEAGUE

Outriggers Tumble Settlement Boys — Wacs Now Sole Possessors of Coveted Lead

In a rough and tumble game the basketball team of the Outtrigger Canoe Club last night pushed the Palama five out of first place in the senior division of the A. A. U. Basketball League, leaving the Waikikis in undisturbed possession. The game was played at the Central Y. M. C. A. and the score was Outtrigger, 37, Palama, 32.

The Outtrigger victory was a surprise to their own admirers, especially as the Beachcombers were without the services of Campbell and Fuller, two of their strong players. However, it was due more to the fact that the Palamas, in their eagerness to win, forgot to play the ball and played their opponents. This gave the Outriggers a chance to feed the ball frequently and regularly to Canario, who seldom failed to score a basket when he got the pigskin in his hands.

The Palamas and the Waikikis will meet in the deciding game of the series next Tuesday night in what promises to be one of the hottest contests of the season. If the Palamas should win, there will be another tie in the lead. The Wacs, however, are favored to win, inasmuch as the personnel of their team is exactly the same as that of the National Guard team which recently won the championship of the Big 6 League by defeating the fast 17th Cavalry aggregation. It is the opinion of disinterested fans that this team is the peer of any other basketball aggregation in the islands.
