

# Onekea Wins Outrigger Swim; Oda Surprise 2nd

Fourteen-year-old George Onekea, the Territory's latest swim sensation from the Hawaii Swimming Club, easily won the Outrigger Canoe Club's feature open water race off Waikiki Thursday.

The Iolani School 9th grader, swimming with a long, steady stroke, in fairly smooth water, finished the 2,000-yard (roughly 1 1/7 mile) distance from near the Natatorium to the finish

line in front of the Outrigger Club in 30 minutes 9 seconds. Come-backer Charles Oda finished a surprise second in 32:12, some 200 yards back of George.

Oda's performance, incidentally, rates more than casual mention.

## Age Group Swim Meet Under Way Tonight at U.H.

The first of the age group swimming meets for the new season gets under way starting at 7 tonight at the University of Hawaii pool.

Twenty-four events are listed on this evening's program and another 24 tomorrow night.

Competing in the meet are the following clubs: Hawaii Swimming Club, Maui's Puunene Community Association, Barber's Point, Central Y.M.C.A., Nuuanu Y.M.C.A., Palama, St. Andrew's Priory, University High School and Y.W.C.A.

Among the outstanding youngsters competing are George Onekea, 14-year-old who placed third in the Senior Outdoor Nationals at Indianapolis this year and Ivanelle Hoe, one of Hawaii's top breaststroke prospects.

### TRAINED 3 WEEKS

The veteran Hawaiian A.A.U. ex-champion had the benefit of only three weeks of training for the grueling race. He had retired from active competition way back in '49.

Starting his swim career under Coach Soichi Sakamoto in the late '30s on Maui, Charley had his best competitive year in '47 when he took second at the Outdoor Nationals in the 800-meter event.

Audrey Char, pretty H.S.C. star, won the women's feature race over the 1,500-yard distance with a time of 24:59.

### CALIFORNIAN 2ND

A newcomer to local swimming, attractive Althea Livingood, of Fresno, California, took second in 25:54. Althea is also a member of H.S.C. under Coach Soichi Sakamoto.

Gay Harris, one of Hawaii's outstanding swimmers in the '20s, was an easy winner in the 2,000-yard event for Outrigger members with a time of 40:55. He maintained a steady pace throughout and finished in fine shape.

A. E. (Toots) Minvielle Jr. was chairman of the meet which club officials hope to make an annual affair hereafter. O.C.C. held its last open water swim some 20 years ago.
