

# CAMPUS STARS WILL PADDLE AT WAIKIKI, MEDALS TO VICTORS

Meet Will Be Held at Same Time as Annual Outrigger Club Stages Big Splash; Many Novices Out at Local University

ON Thanksgiving Day, November 30, the University of Hawaii will hold its annual intra-mural swim at Waikiki Beach under the direction of Coach Theodore "Pump" Searle. The meet will have only five events, medals for which will be given to the three highest men in each swim.

The Thanksgiving meet will have five separate classes: the senior, junior, intermediate, and novice for men, and the open for women. The senior event will be the Castle swim over a distance of one mile, while the junior swim will be the half-mile Cunha swim. The intermediate and novice events will be 440 yards in length, and will be from Canoe Surf to the beach. The wahines in the women's open race will take the same course as the intermediate and novice men.

All the races will finish at Waikiki Beach in front of the Outrigger Canoe club. The use of the Outrigger club premises has been given the University through courtesy of "Dad" Center, an official of the club.

Medals for the winners will be, gold for first, silver for second, and bronze for third. There will be medals for each race, thus making a total of 15 prizes for the day. The medals will be provided for out of the athletic disbursement of the A. S. U. H. budget.

University swimming lettermen, winners of places in A. A. U. meets, and first place winners of interscholastic meets last year will have to enter the senior division. Junior contestants are those members of the varsity team that fell short of earning the letters in past seasons, while intermediates are those who may have entered any meets in the past. Novices will be trying their hand at swimming for the first time.
