

Big Field Compete In U. H. Open Water Meet

Fest Held in Conjunction With Outrigger Club Swim

THE great interest that is being manifested in swimming at the University of Hawaii was clearly demonstrated Thursday morning when one hundred and forty collegians participated in a meet which was held in conjunction with the annual Outrigger Canoe Club open water swim.

And much to the credit of Coach Theodore "Pump" Searle only five out of the 140 swimmers failed to finish in the five events that were held.

Wilbur Crow who finished second to "Toots" Minvielle in the Outrigger open event from the Castles to the beach, won the senior race among the University students over the same distance. His time was 33 minutes 40 3-5 seconds.

Jimmy Hurd was second, Nishimi third, Cedric Weight, fourth; and Ed Park, fifth.

In the Junior event starting from the Public Baths, Ed Tam emerged on top. Kuramoto was second and Mihata was third. This race was hard fought and it was only after a hectic competition that Tam won the event. Tam's time was 21 minutes 44 seconds.

A. Hurd led C. Uchimura to the finish in the Intermediate race and his time was 13 minutes 47 seconds. A. Arledge came in third.

In the girls novice race, Georgina Cooper was first, narrowly beating Jean Pope. Miss D. Brown was third. The winning time was 14 minutes 52 4-5 seconds.

Kubota came through with banners flying high in the Novice Cunha swim for men, negotiating the distance in 15 minutes 1 3-5 seconds. G. Santoki finished second and F. Ching third. This race was close all the way.
