

ENTRIES LISTED FOR EVENTS AT WAIKIKI BEACH

Star-Bulletin Again Offers Trophy For Winner On the Women's Event

The Outrigger Canoe club will again stage its annual Thanksgiving Day swimming events off Waikiki beach, it was announced today by Gay Harris, head of the committee that is handling the meet.

The list of events will be the same as in past years. Briefly they are:

1. Castle's swim for men, open.
2. Women's open from public baths.
3. Boys under 18 from public baths.
4. Boys under 16 from Cunha's.
5. Girls' novice from Cunha's.
6. Men over 30 from public baths.

The races will begin at 9:30 a. m. with all finishes at an anchored canoe in front of the Moana.

Many Prizes

According to Harris, a cup and medals for first three winners will be awarded in each event. The big race of the day, however, is the Castle swim.

The Honolulu Star-Bulletin each year offers a trophy to the winner of the women's public baths swim and is giving a cup this time.

The cup for the Castle swim is provided by Harold Castle. Dawkins, Benny offers a trophy in the race for boys under 18 years of age while Alexander Hume Ford always gives a cup for the girls' novice event.
