

ANNOUNCE LIST OF ENTRIES FOR VARIOUS EVENTS

Star Performers Will Be Seen In Action In Swims Again This Year

The Outrigger Canoe club has announced its annual turkey day swim for Thanksgiving morning, November 27. The program will consist of five open water races, the Castle swim for men, the public baths swim for women, a race for boys under 18, a novice race for girls and an event for men over 30.

As is usual in open water swimming many upsets may occur, and it is not at all surprising to have a "dark horse" win out over the picked champion.

Last year "Toots" Minvielle surprised everybody when he staged a "comeback" and won the Castle swim for men after being out of competition for some time. He is entered in the race this year, but will find the going hard, as Ken Pratt, Tom Ellis and Ken Wood are out to win the trophy.

Tom Ellis finished third in the swim last year, while Ken Wood captured the first place trophy for boys under 18.

Strong Foe

Mildred Slaght, who was expected to win the Public Baths swim last year will find a very strong foe in Olga Clarke. These two are the only entries for the race this year, as Lorena Hines last year's champion is on the coast.

In the novice race for girls, Dot Hammond, Harriet Vaughan, Doris Benny, and Gladys Slaght will swim for first place honors. Dot, who is the only veteran of the group as far as the novice race is concerned, is also the strongest swimmer and should have no trouble in winning.

Again there are four entries in the $\frac{1}{4}$ mile race for men over 30. Cliff Gessler, Bob Askew, Art Powlson and Doctor Withington have signified their intentions of swimming that day. Cliff, who is the present champion, has been seen practicing daily and ought to be in good shape for the race Thanksgiving morning.

The program will start at 9 a. m. each race finishing at an anchored canoe in front of the Outrigger beach.
