

EXPECT RECORDS TO BE SHATTERED IN WAIKIKI SWIM

Castle Mark By Gay Harris In Danger; May Lower Time In Girls' Open

Brilliant swimming feats are being expected of the contestants in the 10th annual Thanksgiving Day races of the Outrigger Canoe club which will stage the program on Thanksgiving Day morning, commencing at 9 o'clock with the feature Castle race.

The record in the Castle mile-and-quarter swim is expected to be shattered by the winner. A fast field, one of the fastest to face the starter's gun in the history of the competition, will be on hand. The record of 28 minutes 31 2-5 seconds by Gay Harris in 1925 is in danger when Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, American mile champion, Eddie Crabbe, Walter Laufer, former one mile Olympic champ, Albert Zorilla, South America flash, Sam Kahana-moku and Tom Ellis dive into the water to start the race.

All Swimmers Entered

George ("Dad") Center, training coach of the Outrigger Canoe club, stated that almost all who are to compete for the laurels of the day have attached their names to the entry list which will close the day before the events. There is little change if any, in the entry list which was first published by The Star-Bulletin.

Following are the records and their holders as well as the year in which they were established:

Castle swim—28 min. 31 2-5 seconds by Gay Harris in 1925.

Boys under 18 (from public baths to anchored canoe)—15 min. 15 2-5 seconds by Benton Wood in 1926.

Girls open (from public baths to anchored canoe)—18 min. 20 3-5 seconds by Miss Janice Lovett in 1926.

Men over 30 (from public baths to anchored canoe)—21 min. 6 2-5 seconds by Clifford Gessler in 1926.

Cunha swim for girls, novice (from Cunha's surf to anchored canoe)—11 min. 36 1-5 seconds by Miss Alice Mitchell in 1926.

Cunha swim for boys under 16 (from Cunha's surf to anchored canoe)—9 minutes flat by W. Newport in 1926.

In the men over 30 event it was J. C. Greaney instead of Greenly, who entered.
