

More Than 40 Swimmers Will Participate In the Outrigger Club Events

Alberto Zorilla, Walter Laufer and
"Buster" Crabbe Entered; Cecily
Cunha Will Also Swim

Over 40 swimmers, including Clarence ("Buster") Crabbe, Walter Laufer, Alberto Zorilla, Cecily Cunha and Mariechen Wehselau—all champions, will perform in the annual Outrigger Canoe club Thanksgiving Day races at Waikiki, it was announced today by George D. ("Dad") Center, Outrigger club swimming coach.

There will be six events. Five handsome cups, including one by The Star-Bulletin for the women's race, will be awarded to the winners.

The entry list, which is open only to members of the Outrigger Canoe club, will close on Wednesday, November 23, or the day before the meet.

The program will commence at 9 o'clock in the morning with the men's Castle swim.

This event is open to the senior members of the club. The swim will be from the old Castle home to the anchored canoe off the Outrigger Canoe club, a distance of about a mile and a quarter. Harold Castle has offered a trophy to the winner.

Following this race will be the women's public bath swim. This is for the senior girls of the club. The trophy is being offered by The Star-Bulletin. The race will be from the public baths to the anchored canoe off the Outrigger Canoe club, a distance of about half a mile.

Third Event

The third event will be a swim for boys under 18. This is also from the public baths to the anchored canoe off the Outrigger club. A cup will go to the winner of this race. Cecil Benny is the donor.

The race for men over 30 will also be from the public baths to the anchored canoe.

For novice girls Alexander Hume Ford, director of the Pan-Pacific union, has offered a cup. They will swim following the race for men over 30. The race is from Cunha's surf to the canoe anchored off the Outrigger club.

After the girls' novice event, boys under 16 will swim the same route, that is, from Cunha's surf to the anchored canoe. Alexander Hume Ford has also offered a trophy to the winner.

Expect Fast Times

With such keen competition this year, "Dad" Center expects to see several records go by the boards. In the Castle swim there are several world beaters who will stage a merry race. The women's senior event is another topnotcher as Cecily Cunha is the half-mile Pacific coast champion. Pitted against Mariechen Wehselau, the coast champion will have to do some real swimming if she is to win.
