

HARRIS WINNER IN ANNUAL SWIM FOR CASTLE CUP

Dope Bucket Is Upset When Gay Harris Defeats A. E. Minvielle

The aquatic dope bucket was tipped considerably at the Outrigger Club's annual distance swim meet at Waikiki beach on Thanksgiving Day when Gay Harris defeated A. E. Minvielle, Jr., for first place in the Castle cup event. Harris covered the mile and a quarter in 28 min. 31 2-5 sec., and was about 65 yards ahead of Minvielle at the finish. H. Wood took third place.

This year's meet probably was the most successful one to be held by the club since it inaugurated the feature in 1917. It was well attended and all of the events were snappy and interesting. By defeating Minvielle, Harris won the Harold Castle trophy, which has been taken by Minvielle during the last two seasons. The course in this event was from the old Castle home to three stakes opposite the Outrigger Club grounds.

In all of the events yesterday, the winners, and those taking second and third places, were awarded medals. Twenty-nine contestants were entered in the various events.

Miss Mariechen Wehselau, local champion, gained added honors by winning the women's open event, the course being from the public baths to the stakes. The time was 22 min. 42 3-5 sec. Miss Janice Lovett was second, and Leilahua Judd third. Miss Wehselau took the trophy which is offered annually by The Star-Bulletin.

Hans Bahr, a new swimmer who is showing considerable promise under the coaching of "Dad" Center, won the event for boys under 18 years, the course being from the public baths to the stakes. Time, 22 min., 54 sec.

Second place was taken by Edgar, and H. Field was third. Bahr was awarded the trophy offered annually by the Dawkins-Benny Co.

R. Askew won the event for men over 30, the course being from the public baths to the stakes. The time was 29 min., 1 1-5 sec. A. S. Bauman took second place. Pat O'Sullivan, who was swimming strong at the start, was compelled to drop out because of cramps.

The event for boys under 16, with a course from the Cunha surf to the stakes, was won by B. Wood. The time was 16 min., 7 sec. Wood, who is being coached by "Dad" Center, made one of the fastest times of the day. A. Hess took second place and W. Newport was third.

In the girls' novice race, from the Cunha surf to the stakes, Miss B. Newport, a new swimmer and recent arrival, won in 18 min., 12 sec. A. Dowse was second and Eleanor Bickerton third. Miss Newport, in addition to a gold medal presented by the Outrigger Club, won the Alexander Hume Ford trophy.

Officials were "Mouse" Smith, starter; A. E. Minvielle, Sr., clerk of the course; E. Cooke, F. Turner and "Dad" Center, timers, and Sam Starret and R. Cowan, judges.
