Entries For Open Water Meet Can Be Filed With 'Dad' Center; Cups To Be Awarded Winners of Four Races; Medals Given To Contestants In All Events

Harold Castle, polo player and general sports enthusiast, has offered to donate a cup to be awarded the winner of the men's Castle swim to be staged opposite the old Castle home at Waikiki Thanksgiving

morning.

The race is staged each year as part of the Outrigger Canoe Club's annual open water classic and Castle plans to award a cup each year to the winner of the event.

Entries for the various events of the open water meet can be filed with "Dad" Center, who is handling

details of the races.

It has been the custom for several years for the Outrigger Canoe club to stage the open water meet on Thanksgiving morning as part of the club's program to encourage open water and distance swimming. This year the races will start promptly at 9 a. m. opposite the old Castle home, the public baths and Cunha's place.

The program includes the following events: Men's Castle swim, women's public bath swim, race for men over 30, public baths, race for boys under 18, public baths, race for boys under 16, Cunha's; girls' (novice) race, Cunha's.

Besides the Castle cup The Star-Bulletin will award a cup to the winner of the women's race, Daw-kins-Benny cup to the winner of the race for boys under 18 and A. H. Ford will give a cup to the winner of the girls' novice race.

The Star-Bulletin awards a cup each year to the winner of the women's race. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded those placing in each event.
