

SIMS WINS SURF SWIM ONCE MORE BY GOOD MARGIN

Mariechen Wehselau First In Women's Race While Helen Moses Is Second

Chester Sims, winner of the 1922 Castle-to-club swim, the annual Thanksgiving event of the Outrigger Canoe club, had no difficulty in outdistancing his two competitors in the race staged yesterday, and came through an easy victor in the time of 24 minutes, 55 2-5 seconds. A. E. Mineville, Jr., finished second, 100 yards behind Sims, while Gay Harris was third.

Mariechen Wehselau won easily in the women's race starting at the public baths. She covered the half-mile course in 17 minutes flat, winning the cup offered by The Star-Bulletin for the event. Helen Moses was second and Janice Lovett third.

Bouldin Burbank won the event for boys under 18 years with F. Reeder second and Hart Wood third. The time was 18:42. K. Makinney was first and A. Hess and Benton Wood second and third in the race for boys under 16. The winner's time was 8 minutes 27 seconds.

Surprise

The event for men more than 30 years old was won by Bob Askew in 23 minutes, 8 1-5 seconds. A. Tullock was second and A. F. Bauman third. The girls' novice event was won by Pauline Laird in 9:48, with Eleanor Bickerton second and Christine Laird third.

Prizes will be presented to the winners at the club dance to be held next Thursday night.
