

Mariechen Wins: Sims Does Same

Thanksgiving Day Swims Of Outrigger Club Are Success

KEEN competition and good times were a feature of the Outrigger Club's annual long distance swims yesterday morning off the beach at Waikiki.

In the open event for men over the Elks' Club to Outrigger Club course of a mile and a half, Chester Sims was winner by a hundred yard lead over his nearest competitor, A. E. Mineville, Jr., while the third man to finish was Harris. Sims' time was minutes 55 2-5 seconds.

Mariechen Wehselau took first honors for women swimmers over the half-mile course and swam the race in seventeen minutes flat. Second was Helen Moses and third, Janice Lovett.

The Elks'-Outrigger course for the race for men over 30 was abandoned, and the swimmers competed over the half-mile course. Bob Askew won first place with a time of 23 minutes 8 1-5 seconds. A. Tullock was second and A. F. Bauman third.

In the girls' novice event of a quarter mile distance, Pauline Laird was winner in nine minutes 48 seconds. Eleanor Bickerton was second and Christine Laird third.

B. Burbank won the half-mile race for boys under 15 years when he swam the distance in 18 minutes 42 seconds. F. Reeder was second and H. Woods third.

K. Makinney won a spectacular race in the quarter-mile swim for boys under fifteen. He defeated A. Hess and B. Wood, who finished second and third respectively. The time was 8 minutes 21 seconds. This was the most hotly contested race of the day.

Mariechen Wehselau in the women's open race won by about a minute over her nearest competitor.
