

CASTLE SURF GRIND DUE ON THANKSGIVING

Cups and Medals Are Ready
And Entry List Is Large,
Promising Keen Contests

Star-Bulletin Puts Up Cup
for Women's Splash,
Public Baths Beach



UT where the big breakers roll off Castle's point is the scene of the start of the annual Outrigger Canoe club open water distance classic on Thanksgiving Day morning. This year there are 23 entries for the six divisions of the race and cups and medals have been obtained for all of the divisions. The Star-Bulletin cup, as usual, will go to the winner of the woman's swim from the public baths to the Outrigger Canoe club diving stand.

The main division of the swim is the men's grind from off Castle's surf to the diving sticks. Last year Chester Sims surprised the fans by defeating W. W. ("Wild Bill") Harris, member of the American Olympic team. One year Carbis Walker won the event, and Walker is now an international figure as a result of swimming Lake Erie and also attempting to swim the English channel. Duke Kahanamoku has also won a Castle-to-club swim.

Favorite

Chester Sims is favorite this year, but A. E. ("Toots") Minvielle, Jr., may give him a good race for it. A. Gay Harris and Kenneth ("Kammy") Ross have also been training faithfully for the event. Some last minute entries are expected. Theo. H. Davies & Co. have donated the cup.

There is another division to the long distance swim, and that is for men over 30 years of age. A. R. Tulloch is the only entrant to date, but others are sure to be in when the race starts. There is a silver medal up.

Women's Race

The main interest centers in the women's race from the Public Baths. The Star-Bulletin cup is at stake in the event and among the entrants are some of the best women swimmers in the world. First there is Mariechen Wehselau, club champion and winner of the event last year. Then there is Helen Moses of the American Olympic team. Dorothy Waters, Constance Davis and Janice Lovett are the other entries.

The boys' race for youngsters under 18 years of age will also start from the Public Baths. Three are entered so far, including Fred Reeder, Boulding Burbank and H. Wood. Dawkins, Benny have put up the cup.

Ford Cups

The boys' junior race for those under 16 years of age will start at Cunha's surf. The entry list includes C. Chapin, K. MacKinney, B. Wood, A. Hess, F. Trotter and H. Ellis.

The girls' novice swim will be from Cunha's surf. Eleanor Bickerton, Pauline Laird, H. Kishler and Christine Laird are entered. Alexander Hume Ford has put up cups for the last two mentioned races.

Silver and bronze medals will be given to second and third places in all races where more than three starts.

A dance will be held at the club on Thanksgiving Day night and the cups and prizes will be presented to the winners during an intermission between dances.
