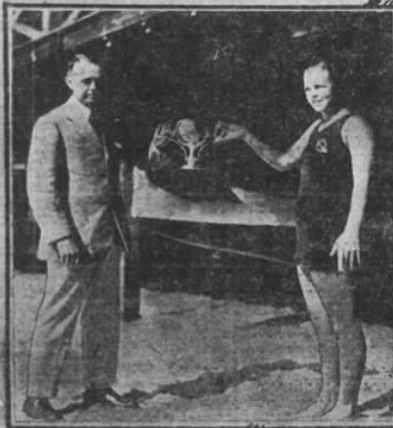


# SNAPPED AT THE OUTRIGGER THANKSGIVING DAY RACES
