

CASTLE-TO-CLUB RACE TO START AT TEN O'CLOCK

Fans Can Go Out in Canoes
and See Entire Race for
Payment of Little Cash

W. (Mouse) Smith will fire the starting pistol at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning to revive the Outrigger Canoe club's Thanksgiving Day outdoor swim. The swim from Castle's point to the Outrigger Canoe club diving stand was held twice in 1917 and has not been staged since.

The race is divided into three sections. The girls will swim from the Public Baths to the Outrigger Canoe club diving stand and so will the boys under 16 years. The first race to get away will be for the boys. Then the officials will move over to Castle's and start the senior race. As soon as the men have passed the Public Baths the girls will be started.

Good Chance

The Outrigger club is making a gala morning of it and anyone who wants to go along in an outrigger canoe and see the start of the three races and follow the competitors in to the finishing line can do so. A fleet of canoes in the hands of capable steersmen will be ready at the Outrigger club at 9 a. m.

A slight charge of 25 cents for each person going will be made and the funds will go towards the expenses of the event. This will give a lot of local folks who have never been out in an outrigger a chance to get a new thrill.

A canoe will be anchored on the mauka side of the diving stand and a rope stretched from it to the poles as the finishing line. Judges will be in this canoe.

The best place to see the race is from along the route in the canoes or from the Manoa pier or Outrigger Canoe club pavilion.
