Lewis of Fort Kamehameha was the big star of the football game at Fort Kamehameha yesterday morning when the Coast Defense team defeated Battery A of the 1st Field Artillery by a score of 40 to 0.

Lewis is perhaps one of the fastest men playing football in Hawaii today and those who have seen him in action believe that he is the fastest running half back in the islands. Lewis is faster than Davis, and appears to have an edge on the Y. M. C. A. star in punting. With McVey, Irwin, Stoddard and Lewis, Coach Meyer has a great back field.

Coach Meyer played two years on the navy team, and in these two years the navy won from the army. He has been coaching this squad into playing real football and the Coast Defense team looks to be the best coached team that has played in the city this season.

A forward pass Irwin to Stoddard gave the Coasters the first touchdown. Lewis runs for a long touchdown. Lewis scored the third touchdown after a 40 yard run.
