Two hundred and twenty-yard swim for men, novice—C. Sims, first, time 2:56; Edric Cook, second, and H. Smith, third.

Fifty-yard swim for women, novice—Miss H. Martin, first, time forty-eight seconds; Miss D. Martin, second, and Miss A. Mooney, third.

Fifty-yard swim for boys under fifteen years—P. Chapin, first, time thirty-six and three-fifths seconds; A. Minville Jr., second; Ernest Cook, third.

Fifty-yard swim for men—G. Harris, first, time thirty-four and three-fifths seconds; F. Bowers, second, and R. Watt, third.

Fifty-yard backstroke swim for women—Miss E. Lyser, first, time fifty-eight seconds; Miss L. Drew, second, and Miss Josephine Hopkins, third.

Hundred-yard breaststroke for boys under fifteen years—Ernest Cook, first, time 2:52; A. Minville Jr., second, and P. Chapin, third.

Hundred-yard backstroke for men—G. Harris, first, time 1:41; M. Harvey, second, and C. Lambert, third.

Surfboard paddling, malihini entries, from Seaside Hotel to Moana Pier—C. Sims, first, time 2:32; Private Rushforth, second.
