Oxford To Race Old Rival On Saturday

Cambridge Set for Annual Event Scheduled Early in Day

LONDON, March 26.—The annual boat race between Oxford and Cambridge universities will be rowed on Saturday at the earliest hour on record for the event.

The crews will take to the water at 10 o'clock in the morning, London time, just when frequenters of night clubs in San Francisco will be getting into their stride Friday night. Those in New York will be thinking of calling it a day.

In previous years the race always has been rowed at a time permitting enormous crowds to see it. This year, on account of the tides, thousands of people from office boys to bank managers, will be disappointed. In the past from 500,000 to 1,000,000 people have seen the race but on Saturday the crowd is expected to be so small.

PREDICT EVEN RACE

The tide will be not only early but slow. For this reason critics predict that the race will be one of the most even in years.

Oxford, in choosing its material, has gone in for weight as one of the best means of regaining its waning prestige. Even so, the Oxford crew will be fourteen pounds lighter than Cambridge. Neither crew has settled down for consistent training which usually features preparation for the race and there has been almost daily changes in the personnel of both crews.

For the first time in years there will be no Americans in either crew. Saturday's race will be the eightieth occasion on which the universities' "wet-bobs" as they are traditionally known, will have met. Oxford has won 40 of the races and Cambridge 30. There was a dead-heat in 1877. From 1915 to 1919, inclusive, there was no racing on account of the war but since then Cambridge has won seven races. The only post-war Oxford victory was in 1923.

Chuck Horton Unable to Go On Hilo Trip

Horton will not be with his club because of local business demands.
