

Many Athletes Entered In All Events; Trials Needed In Many Races

Finals Tomorrow in Hammer Throw; Plan to Run Semi-Finals in 100- Yard Dash at Trials

Trials for the A. A. U. championship track and field meet will be held in 15 events at Alexander field Thursday afternoon starting at 4 p. m., according to announcement made today by E. T. Chase, who is handling arrangements for the meet.

An exceptionally large number of entries have been received for all events, making it necessary to hold trials in seven track events in addition to the field and pit competitions.

Unless a number of athletes drop out at the last minute there will be some very fast trials tomorrow as it will be necessary to eliminate a number of entries before the finals Saturday afternoon.

In addition to the trials there will be finals in the 16-pound hammer throw tomorrow afternoon.

END OF SEASON IN SIGHT FOR COMMERCIALITES

It has been decided by the officials to run the semi-finals in the 100-yard dash at the trials tomorrow instead of holding them at the meet Saturday.

Pit and field events will start at 4 p. m., the pole vault being the first of the pit events while the finals of the hammer throw are listed first among the field events. Trials will be held in other field events in the following order—shot-put, discus and javelin. In addition to the pole vault trials will be held in the high jump and the broad jump.

Trials in the track events will be run off in the following order: 100-yard dash (four heats); 50-yard dash for women; 100-yard dash semi-finals; 120-yard high hurdles; 440-yard run; 60-yard hurdles for women; 220-yard dash and 220-yard low hurdles.

Chase declared today that he plans to handle the trials the same as the meet itself and that the field will be kept clear of spectators during the trials, officials being the only persons to be on the field.

Drawings have been held for the relay events with the following results:
