

# New Marks Likely in Rainbows Track Meet

## University Picked to Win Half Mile; Fernandez Is Hurt

WITH the annual Rainbow Relay carnival at Kam field tomorrow at 1:30 o'clock, intense interest is being shown throughout the city among track fans in the several relay races that will be staged.

The half-mile and quarter-mile relays are the center of much speculation. The university quartet, with Wakatake, Ching, Giles and Farden, tied the island record for the 440-relay in practice on Wednesday, with plenty of reserve power, so that the Rainbow men are expected to take this event.

The record will likely be slashed tomorrow, when the fleet Varsity runners step with the powerful Outrigger crew, in McGuire, Crozier, Melim and Penhallow.

University is also given a slight edge in the half-mile, with Outrigger hot behind. Penhallow may cut the tape before Farden in this race, as the furlong is his favorite distance. But if the other three Rainbow men give Farden any sort of a lead, the Manoa flash should travel like a streak until he hits the tape ahead of the ex-Dean sprinter. Mountcastle and Fernandez may run with Ching and Farden in this event.

Fernandez pulled a tendon Wednesday but he will probably be in shape to run anchor on the mile-relay with Mountcastle, Wakatake and Giles or Ching. Fernandez has been running in rare form this week and his well-known fighting spirit may carry him to victory over the Outrigger war-horse, Devcrill.

Palama is supreme in the distance relays, with University, Army and Outrigger following. If pressed at all, Palama's quartet should run off with a couple of new island records tomorrow.

The medley will be a thrilling race. University has a good chance to win, with "Waialua" Low in the mile, Ventnor Williams in the 880, Mountcastle or Wakatake in the 440.
