

# Expect Close Competition In Pit and Field Events

From the present outlook of things the pit and field events of the Rainbow Relay Carnival, which is to be held Saturday afternoon on Kamehameha field, will be no less exciting to sport lovers than the individual races and the relays.

Palama leads in number of entries in the field and pit competitions with nine; the Outrigger club comes second with eight; the University of Hawaii third with seven; the Y. M. C. A. fourth with four; and the Army fifth with two.

De Mello appears to be Palama's best man in the shot put, discus and javelin, having placed first in the first two events at the trials and second in the last event. If he puts forth a little extra effort he may also be able to nick out a first place in the javelin, although Lum of the Y. M. C. A. beat him in the trials.

## Outrigger Stars

The Outrigger's main point annexers in the pit and field events will be Dick Gartley, Carl Farden, Wicke, Gannon, Anderson, Akina and Cabrinha. Gartley will doubtless have his way in the pole vault. Carl Farden qualified for the Outrigger club in both the shot put and the discus and will probably bring home a number of points for his team, especially in the discus.

## In High Jump

Gannon, Anderson and Akina placed in order in the high jump, and that event looks like a complete Outrigger affair as far as the first three places are concerned. Gannon has been doing his usual starring in the high jump, the interscholastic record for which belongs to him. Anderson and Akina may grab off the next two places after Gannon annexes the first mount, and again they may not. French of the army and Walter Holt of the university, the other two entrants, may precipitate the dope solution by beating out either of them.

Wicke placed second for the Outrigger in the pole vault trials — ahead of Correia, who won this event in the recent interskol meet. Whether or not Correia will rally and come to the fore is difficult to

foretell. Cabrinha is the only Outrigger entry in the javelin throw.

## Dean Stars

The university will be represented in the pit and on the field by Wriston, Holt and Hung Wai Ching. These three Deans will, in fact, have to make the entire showing for the varsity in the pit and field events because they are the only Green and White entries. Wriston placed second in both the shot put and discus trials. Holt placed for the university in the discus, javelin, high jump and broad jump, and although he may not place among the first he will probably bring down a number of points for the university. Hung Wai Ching, besides being one of the university's most skilled runners, will probably star in the running broad jump also. He came first in the trials.

## Placed First

Lum, Wagner and Tanimura represent the Y. M. C. A. in the discus, javelin and pole vault. Lum placed first in the javelin at the trials, but will have to watch his step in order to keep himself ahead of De Mello, who is a close second in this event. Tanimura placed ahead of Correia in the pole vault and displays a good jumping form. Wagner is along with Lum in the javelin throw for the Y. M. C. A.

French and Crawford are the army's sole representatives in pit and field. French is entered in the pole vault, and Crawford in the high jump.

Naiwi, Lee, Kané, Itoga and Correia will probably win valuable second or third places for Palama in the shot put, pole vault and broad jump.
