

Track Stars Performing At Kamehameha Field Today

The third annual Rainbow Relay Carnival, held under the auspices of the University of Hawaii, is being staged this afternoon at 1:30 p. m. at Kamehameha field.

Ten races, including six relays; three pit events; and three field events, make up the day's program. Five teams—The Outrigger Club, the University of Hawaii, Palama, the Army, and the Y. M. C. A. are competing for the final honors.

Winners of first, second and third places in the individual events will receive awards, as will the winning teams in the relays. First place winners in the individual events will be presented with gold medals. Second place winners will get silver medals, and winners of third places will be awarded with bronze medals, and winners of third places will be awarded with bronze medals. Cups in 440-yard club relay, the half-mile club relay, the one-mile club relay, the two-mile club relay, the four-mile club relay, and the medley club relay, all put up by the University of Hawaii, will be at stake.

Winner In Novice

The first place winner of the 100 yards novice race will be presented with the Charles Paddock cup and a gold medal, while second and third place winners will get silver and bronze medals. Those who stand the chances of winning this race are: French, Dasher, Channon, Hadley and Jones of the Army;

Yap, Auld, McGuire, Crozier of the Outrigger Club; Harrison and Itoga of Palama; and Kam Tai Lee of the University. Crozier, French, Lee, Harrison, Itoga and McGuire stand the best chance of grabbing off the first honors.

The 220-yard low hurdles is expected to be one of the best of the individual events. Ching and Fernandez of the University; Melim, McGuire, and Crozier of the Outrigger; and Lum of Palama are the entries in this race. Ching and Fernandez are considered expert hurdlers by university-ites, and Melim and McGuire have an equal reputation around Punahou and in interscholastic circles. Crozier is an old candidate on the track and bids fair to be among the foremost in this race. Lum of Palama showed a clean, fast heel in the trials. In fact all six runners are thoroughly familiar with their race and should give the spectators a thrilling event. The record will probably be smashed.

No Trials

There have been no trials of the relays and consequently an exact forecast of these races is difficult. The edge seems to lie with the Outrigger Club, however, and it is a cinch that their 440 relay, half-mile relay, and mile relay teams are about as perfect as one could hope for. On the 440 and 800 teams, Crozier, Melim, McGuire and Dick Penhallow will run. In the mile relay Cabrinha, Danford, Crozier, and Deverill will represent the Outrigger. And unless we miss our guess those three teams are going to do some excellent performing.

Gartley in the pole vault, De Mello in the discus and shot, and Hung Wai Ching in the running broad jump, will probably star in the field events, along with Gannon, who has his nibs on the first place in the high jump.
